

WINNING LIFE

Research suggests grit is a more accurate predictor of success than social intelligence, good looks, physical health or IQ. The Elks have been developing gritty kids through the Hoop Shoot program for more than 40 years.

A key to developing grit in children is to encourage them to set goals and work hard at something they enjoy doing. That's why the Hoop Shoot works so well. Basketball is a fun activity, so kids don't mind practicing for hours to improve their shot.

The connection between time spent practicing and improved performance reinforces gritty behavior. These lessons help kids bounce back and keep trying even when they don't succeed the first time, whether on the court or in the classroom.
