Gratitude Grants

- \$2,000 grants available to Lodges that meet the GER's per-member goal for giving to the ENF. Lodges where more than 15 percent of its members donated at least \$10 to the ENF in 2015-16 qualify for a bonus of \$500.
- For local, charitable activities that serve community members.



Beacon Grants

- \$2,000 grants available to every Lodge.
- For an ongoing, charitable, Elks-driven community project that is new the first time the Lodge applies.
- CANNOT be a donation of funds or supplies, must have an active component.



Promise Grants

- \$2,500 grants available to the first 500 Lodges that apply with a qualifying Elks-led youth event.
- Provide an opportunity for Elks to be positive role models for youth in need.
- CANNOT be a donation of funds or supplies, must have an active component.



Freedom Grants

- \$2,000 grants awarded to the 200 Lodges whose projects are judged to best serve the needs of veterans and/or active-duty military members.
- Meaningful Elk involvement is strongly encouraged, and increases chances of approval.



Impact Grants

- \$2,500 to \$10,000 grants to run Elks-led service projects in the community.
- CANNOT be used as a large donation of funds or supplies.
- All Lodges welcome to apply to this competitive grant



Grants should follow IRS-defined charitable categories:

- Relieve the poor, distressed
 Combat juvenile
 or underprivileged
 delinquency
- Advance education, but not
 Eliminate prejudice and discrimination
- Lessen the burdens of elessen neighborhood government
 Lessen neighborhood tensions

Remember: Projects with active Elk involvement are best!



Grants may not be used for:

- Fundraisers
- General community events
- Poster and/or essay contests
- The benefit of Lodge members and their families
- State Major Projects/ national Elks programs

- Scholarships
- Youth awards nights
- Appreciation dinners
- Lodge maintenance and/or repairs
- Hoop Shoot or Soccer Shoot

Gratitude Grant Guidelines

- Local means your Lodge community. Regional and state projects don't qualify.
- Veterans projects must focus on one of five areas of increased need
 - employment
 - homelessness and housing
 - military families
 - health
 - educational support
- 2016-17 Gratitude Grant Deadline: May 31, 2017 at 11:59 CST
- Grants must be used between when the Lodge applies and July 31, 2017.
- Grants are not intended to reimburse projects the Lodge has already run.



It's not just the Secretary's job

- The Lodge Secretary has ability to appoint anyone from the Lodge as a Grants Coordinator (with the Exalted Ruler's approval).
- Grants Coordinator can access online grant applications through the ENF website using their elks.org username and password.
- Coordinator should be computer savvy.
- Lodges can have more than one, and they can be appointed at any time.
- Coordinator should ideally be involved with the grant from start to finish.

- \$2,000 grants available to all Lodges that reach the GER's member goal for giving to the ENF.
- If your Lodge met the 2016-17 per capita goal of \$4.65, you have access to the application.
- 2016-17 Gratitude Grants are due May 31, 2017 at 11:59 pm CT.

Online Application

- Secretaries have automatic access through CLMS.
- Grant Coordinators must be appointed online by Secretary, with ER's permission. Access is through grant webpages.

2. Grant Description

Category: Crisis Support, Other Youth Activity, Community Educational Event

Audience: Other Community Issues, Youth

Describe your Lodge's charitable project and how it will serve the community.

The Hillsboro Elks Lodge #1862 intends to use the funds from the Gratitude Grant to provide an opportunity for a local charity to expand their outreach to seriously ill children in several local children's medical center. Rockin' Rooms is a local charity that provides decorations to children who due to health reasons must spend more than a month staying in a local hospital. Currently, each time a request is received by Rockin' Rooms, volunteers must shop for and assemble baskets that contain sheets, blankets, bath towels, wall decorations, art supplies, and many other items appropriate for each request. The funds from the Gratitude Grant will allow the Lodge to "pre-build" 15-20 of the most requested baskets. The ability to shop for and pre-assemble these baskets will not only save money (because items can be purchased on sale and stockpiled), but also will allow volunteers to respond much more quickly to incoming requests.

- Tell us why your event is charitable.
 - Focus on charity and service. Promotion of the Lodge is great but is not the purpose of grants.
 - Focus on what the Lodge intends to do with the grant funds only.



Tell us about your community. Why is this as an important community need?

In our area we have several hospitals that care for seriously ill children - Doernbecher's Children's Hospital; Randall's Children's Hospital, and the Portland Shriner's Hospital. Many of the children who are admitted to these hospitals are there for extended periods of time - weeks and even months. Their rooms are drab and 'medical' (as all hospital rooms can be). As anyone can attest, even sick children are still children. They long for the opportunity to play, laugh, and enjoy life. While we can't make their hospital stay any shorter, or heal them any faster, we can at least make their rooms less dreary and foreboding! Rockin' Rooms was founded by a family whose own child was in Doernbecher's Children's Hospital with a serious illness for an extended period of time. His mother and grandmother (who are both members of our Lodge) decided one day to decorate his room. It was such a hit with staff and other patients that they founded Rockin' Rooms to provide the same opportunity to other patients. We are blessed that their young child came through with flying colors and is now a happy, healthy little boy. We want to use the funds from the Gratitude Grant to make these requests more easily granted to other families in need.

Is there an opportunity for Elks to get involved in this project? Please tell us how Elks will participate.

As was previously mentioned, the founders of Rockin' Rooms are members of our Lodge and we are planning to increase Elks involvement in the following ways: 1. Elks will shop for the items that are used to create the baskets for each child. 2. Our Well Wishes With Stitches group will make blankets, pillow cases, and other items as appropriate for the basket. They currently donate hundreds of chemo-bag covers each year to the Chilren's Hospitals and will add these to each basket as needed. 3. Once the grant is received and supplies have been purchased, we will hold an 'assembly party' so that members of the Lodge who want to volunteer will come assemble the pre-made baskets. 4. As appropriate and allowed by the hospital, Elks members will be delivering the baskets to each child.

- Describe how members will be involved with this project.
- Remember—active projects are *always* better for the Lodge.



What does the Lodge expect to accomplish with this project? How will the Lodge measure its success?

Currently, it takes approximately a week to respond to each request for a basket to decorate a child's room. We hope to cut that response time in most cases to 3-4 days (or less). We also hope to be able to provide more baskets and perhaps add more hospitals. We have had requests from other local hospitals, but are limited to how many baskets we have the resources to fulfill.

Be Specific

- Itemize your expected expenses.
- The budget should show us that you have a plan for the funds, and have considered how best to use them.
 - Don't just write "supplies", tell us what the supplies are.
- Budget should match up with the application and reflect that grant funds are needed to hold this event.
 - Focus on fundamental expenses.
- Total cost of event will automatically total from the line items you provide
- Total grant request should be at least equal to grant request.
 - Ex: The Lodge receives \$2,000 and should apply for that amount at minimum.



Budget Narrative

Each decorating basket contains items that will decorate a room in a specific theme - Star Wars, Frozen, My Little Pony, etc. The point is to brovide each child with enough 'non-medical' related decorations and activities as is appropriate for each child based on their age, their requested theme, their health needs, and their families wishes. Older children and teens often ask for such things as batteries for IPADs or nail polish; while younger children are more interested in art supplies, coloring books and stuffed animals. The volunteers at Rockin' Rooms have developed a list of items that are most appropriate for children who are residing long term in a hospital setting. None of the budget line items address overhead costs or operation costs associated with the operations or delivery of the baskets. Only hard costs associated with the basket and it's contents have been included in our request for funds.

Spread the word! Here are some tips on how to do so.

- Before the event, tell everyone! Use your Lodge newsletter, Facebook page, Twitter account, the community bulletin board, or an email list to recruit volunteers.
- Take photos at the event.
- Get feedback. Ask volunteers how they think it went. Talk to the people being served. Follow up with your project partners. Write down good quotes. Keep thank you letters. These are all great for publicity.
- After the event, use the ENF news release generator to create a professional-sounding news release.

Milwaukee, Wis., Lodge No. 46 uses a Gratitude Grant to conduct a summer food drive during the months of June, July and August when traditionally the donations to local food pantries are extremely low.





Bloomington, Ill., Lodge No. 281 partners with Heartland Head Start program to hold a welcome back to school event. The Elks give backpacks and required school supplies to 250 registered students. The Lodge partners with the Normal Lions to offer eye exams and the fire and police departments distribute safety information.





Santa Cruz, Calif., Lodge No. 824 puts their membership and the Gratitude Grant to work! The Lodge provided much needed safety updates and repairs, along with baby supplies, to the Siena House, a maternity home for new and expecting mothers.
