Our fourth annual Leadership Weekend (#Lead4) is in the books. The weekend was educational, inspirational and fun for all involved. (Some of the scholars are pictured above in the Rotunda of the Elks Veterans Memorial.)

"It's one of those things where you're glad it's over but wish it weren't," says Programs Relationship Associate Maryann Slater, who spent months planning and organizing the weekend.

More than 30,000 high school seniors nationwide applied for the 2017 Most Valuable Student scholarship, which is based on academics, leadership and financial need. Twenty finalists were invited to attend the Leadership Weekend from April 6 to 9 in Chicago. Each was guaranteed a scholarship of \$20,000. During the weekend, they had the opportunity to interview for top awards of \$30,000, \$40,000 and \$50,000. But the weekend was about so much more than those 20-minute interviews.

The scholars forged bonds with one another and the staff. They participated in activities that helped identify their core values. They explored Chicago. They served veterans at the Jesse Brown V.A. Medical Center. They scarfed down deep-dish pizza. And they shared personal stories of tragedy and triumph, of hardship and perseverance, of discovery and hope.

"When the scholars arrived on Thursday," Slater says, "their compasses were calibrated toward their own goals and ambitions. The things that got them to the

The photo above perfectly captures the essence of this issue of *Heartbeat*, which is mostly about the two big events of April—our fourth annual Leadership Weekend and the National Finals of the Hoop Shoot. But it's also an apt metaphor for our approach to programming.

First, although the guy at the top of the stairs is shooting a basketball, this was taken during the Leadership Weekend, not the Hoop Shoot. We caught the shot during the iconic scavenger hunt at the Elks Veterans Memorial.

The scavenger hunt aims to educate the top 20 Most Valuable Students about the Order in an entertaining way. Teams can earn a bonus point by participating in a mini-Hoop Shoot contest. It's cross-promotion that introduces the Hoop Shoot as a possible outlet for future service.

Second, consider the shooter. It's Nathan Miller, a 2014 Most Valuable Student finalist. Nathan has attended all four Leadership Weekends, the past three as a scholar leader. His job was to engage the finalists, answer their questions about college and the Elks scholarship, and ensure that everyone has a positive experience. As a former finalist who now also serves on the Elks Scholar Advisory Board, he's especially well-suited for the scholar leader role. Winning the scholarship is just the beginning.

Third, note the rebounder. It's Billy Donnelly, our youth programs associate who coordinates the Hoop Shoot for us. Two weeks before the Finals, and there he is, pitching in to help his peers who work on scholarships. And they returned the favor at the Hoop Shoot. We're all in this together.

Finally, Nathan and Billy are having a blast. We're proud of the work we do, but we're also cognizant that the Order of Elks first convened to have fun.

Nathan sank the shot, and so did we.

Leadership Weekend. But by the time they left on Sunday, those needles were also pointing toward their Elks Family.”

Throughout the weekend, Slater and Elks Scholar Fellow Jenna Johnson stressed the many engagement opportunities available to Elks scholars. And the idea of Elks Family was reinforced by the presence of other scholars participating in the weekend.

Scholar Leaders Jay Little and Nathan Miller, who were in the finalists' shoes themselves last year and in 2014, respectively, shared their wisdom in a presentation on the college experience on Thursday evening. And former top winners Sean Loosli (2003), Bryce Caswell (2003) and Joanne Dynak (2012) served on the judging panels.

“When they tell you that you’re now part of the Elks Family, they mean it,” Miller says.

Parting on Sunday was difficult for scholars and staff alike, but it wasn’t goodbye.

“Their journeys are just beginning,” Slater says, “and the Elks will be a part of it.”

“Our Most Valuable Students are going to change the world,” adds Jim O’Kelley, the director of the Elks National Foundation. “We’re looking forward to following their careers.”

Last year was a banner one for Beacon Grants. For the first time ever, we awarded more than 1,000 Beacon Grants! Maybe that's not as big a deal as the Cubs finally winning the World Series, but it *is* a goal we've been working toward for a few years. In March and April alone, the Community Investments Program office approved nearly 400 grants. Talk about a hitting streak!

"We've been crazy busy, but meeting our goal of 1,000 approved grants means that more Lodges are using our funds to create meaningful change in their communities," says Jocelyn Moya, who coordinates Beacon Grants for the Foundation's Programs Department. "We will continue to work with Lodges to fund active, Elk-led charitable projects this year, too!"

But first, we'll grab some bench and enjoy the view. July 1 and the new grants cycle will be here soon enough.






