Describe your Lodge's charitable activity and how it will serve local youth.

The Madison Elks Lodge #410 would like to help The Rainbow Project which is a non-profit counseling clinic that provides crisis treatment and early intervention services to young children and their families who have experienced or witnessed trauma, such as child abuse, child sexual abuse, neglect, domestic violence and community violence. The staff, clinicians and therapists provide an amazing service; however, their facility is in need of repairs. We have invited our local Boy Scout Troup #410, which is the only troop for disabled boys in Wisconsin, to join us along with the assistance of members and leaders from Troop #11. With the help of these two Boy Scout troops and members of our lodge, we will be working together to make the renovations needed to help the Rainbow Project improve their facilities.

Why is this project needed in your community? How will the Lodge make an effort to reach youth in need?

Our Lodge is teaming up with the Rainbow Project to help with a design makeover for this local counseling clinic. The goal of the project, called "Design for a Difference-Madison" is the redesign of the space to provide a modern, positive environment for that creates a calming, atmosphere of trust and safety. The current Center is in constant demand and the majority of its operating budget is used for direct programs and not on the facility. The money from our grant will help the Design team to make their space more functional and an emotional safe-haven for the children they serve.
