- **Holiday Island, AR, Lodge No. 1042:** Elks will provide **books for first graders** and create and distribute print materials to encourage low-income families to read with their children.
- San Diego, CA, Lodge No. 168: Elks will assist in creating public awareness and volunteer assistance to Partners Therapeutic Horsemanship. Elks will host a Horse Show with BBQ, sponsor students to participate in other horse shows, and sponsor scholarships for an eight week session.
- Chico, CA, Lodge No. 423: Elks will start a SAGE (Students for the Advancement of Global Entrepreneurship) program at three high schools in Chico. Through this program, students start real world businesses and social enterprises, as well as compete at statewide, national and worldwide competitions.
- El Cajon, CA, Lodge No. 1812: Elks will initiate a
 program to aggressively seek donations of musical
 instruments for use by needy children in a local
 youth symphony. Additionally, the Elks Lodge will host
 a youth symphony concert.
- Rancho Cordova, CA, Lodge No. 2484: Elks will provide year-round material support and food to families of military personnel posted overseas, returning injured and maimed vets, and families with special needs identified by local police and fire departments.



- Bridgeport, CT, Lodge No. 36: Elks will provide a monthly meal and care packages to the residents of Homes for the Brave, a transitional shelter for homeless veterans.
- Naugatuck, CT, Lodge No. 967: Elks will assist senior citizens in maintaining their homes through simple maintenance and energy improvements.

• Cocoa Beach, FL, Lodge No. 2387: Elks will provide veterans with care packages of essential items to help them through the rehabilitation process and during key transition periods when the veteran is returning to an independent living situation.



- Lake Placid, FL, Lodge No. 2661: Elks will partner with Meals on Wheels of Lake Placid to
 initiate and implement a new organization that will deliver meals to clients in the Greater Lake
 Placid community.
- Port Orange, FL, Lodge No. 2723: Elks will provide holiday meals to homebound seniors who depend on meal delivery service.
- Marion, IL, Lodge No. 800: Elks will provide personal hygiene products for people in lowor crisis-income situations to help ease financial burdens while encouraging a healthier lifestyle.
- Ashland, KY, Lodge No. 350: Elks will improve an existing after-school program for atrisk students and expand it to other school locations. Activities will include sports, gardening,
 art, music and drama. Events to include parents will also be held.
- Chestertown, MD, Lodge No. 2474: Elks will purchase and distribute food bins to collect non-perishable foods throughout Kent County. Elks will collect donations monthly and deliver them to the food pantry.



- Ferndale, MI, Lodge No. 1588: Elks will develop an after-school program to target students in fourth through sixth grades. Activities will focus on increased math and reading skills while also developing leadership skills and community involvement.
- Midland, MI, Lodge No. 1610: Community organizations are coming together to build a community recreation center and medical building. Elks will purchase kitchen equipment,

preschool play equipment, and computer equipment for the new community recreation center.

- Rahway, NJ, Lodge No. 1075: To improve literacy and cultural awareness, Elks will
 interact with second graders, assisting them in understanding other cultures and preparing
 recipes from around the world. They will also donate related books to the school libraries.
- Toms River, NJ, Lodge No. 1875: Elks will educate businesses on the benefits and importance of hiring young adults with disabilities and set-up a "job sampling" program for students to gain work experience while in school.
- **Greater Wildwood, NJ, Lodge No. 1896:** Elks will work with a local food pantry to **distribute fresh produce** to those in need throughout the Greater Wildwood community.
- Lockport, NY, Lodge No. 41: Elks will establish an annual week-long summer camp tailored to meet the needs of people with disabilities.
- Rotterdam, NY, Lodge No. 2157: Elks will provide funding for various repairs and renovations of a park, including repairing public restrooms and restoring a community room used by senior groups.
- Lock Haven, PA, Lodge No. 182: Elks will form a partnership with the YMCA to offer nutrition and fitness programs to local youths who want to make a positive change in their lifestyle.
- New Braunfels, TX, Lodge No. 2279: Elks will start a program to provide low-cost or free dental services and educate the community on preventative care.



- Stephenville, TX, Lodge No. 2834: Elks will work with other organizations to build an accessible baseball field with sidewalks, dugouts and bleachers.
- Naval (Port Angeles), WA, Lodge No. 353: Elks will convert two unused tennis courts located
 in the Elks Memorial Playfield into six pickle ball courts. After the conversion is complete, Elks
 will sponsor pickle ball leagues for seniors and students.
- Wausau, WI, Lodge No. 248: Elks will become a major contributor of both volunteers and funding to provide elderly and disabled adults with the freedom a ramp provides.
