

Oregon Elks find historic stained glass

One hundred years ago, the 1912 Elks Grand Lodge Convention was held in Portland, OR. It featured an elaborate display of electric lights at a time when less than half of American homes had electricity. Four beautiful stained glass windows were made for display. Recently, one of these windows was discovered by a Brother Elk in a stained glass restoration shop. A group of volunteers from the Elks Children's Eye Clinic and the Beaverton, OR Lodge #1989 raised funds to purchase the window, and it now hangs in the 5th floor lobby of the Eye Clinic, which is sponsored by the Oregon Elks Association Major Project. We are pleased to preserve and share this piece of Elks history.


Welcome 250 new members – via online membership inquiry


