for children with sight or speech issues; and many other physical and mental disorders. Elks also sponsor alternative schools; provide emergency shelters for abused and neglected children; provide mobile dental care; award scholarships; and provide career training for adults with developmental disabilities. We also award financial aid to community hospitals, Special Olympics, as well as Alzheimer's programs and services.

I had the opportunity to meet with military leaders and Veterans Administration officials during my visit to Washington DC, where I received resounding gratitude and admiration for the Elks' service to the military and for our veterans. I also visited numerous veterans homes nationwide, where the local administrators had nothing but praise for our volunteer VAVS representatives who visit and provide comfort, support and aid to those confined in veterans homes, hospitals and other facilities.

I also would like to share with you some encouraging news regarding membership. Over the past three years we have decreased our losses from 1.6 percent at the end of the 2015 Lodge year, to 1.1 percent at the end

BPOE ever so close to a Plus-1

The BPOE is poised to make its strongest progress in membership since 1980. Just before the membership-closing deadline for 2016-17, we are down just 4,900 Members or 0.6 percent. That's a 50 percent improvement from the 1.1 percent loss in 2015-16.

The really good news is 44 of 48 State Associations showed a year over year improvement.

Congratulations and thank you for all you have done to help make that happen.

Dictionary Project provides great PR for little cost

How can Elks Members help our youth and have great public relations for little cost? By participating in the National Dictionary Project.

Many Elks Lodges nationwide have helped distribute about 3 million books to third-grade students since we joined this movement in 2004.

A dictionary is perhaps the first and most powerful reference tool a child may own. Its usefulness goes beyond the spelling, pronunciation and definitions it lists; it is a companion for solving problems that arise as a child develops his or her reading, writing and creative-thinking abilities. The goal of this program is to assist students in becoming good writers, active readers, creative thinkers and resourceful learners.

Many educators see third grade as the dividing line between learning to read and reading to learn. We encourage our sponsors to give dictionaries each year to children in the third grade. All formal education from this point through college is premised upon students being able to read and to understand what they read.

Why should our Lodge get involved in the program? Because it is one of the easiest projects you can do, and also the one to give you the biggest bang for your buck. It is a great way to spend your Elks grant money.

the Dictionary Project website at www. dictionaryproject.com. View the different dictionaries on their bookshelf page. (Prices go from \$36 to \$60 per box of 24.) Pick the dictionary you prefer. You can also purchase a sample pack of eight of their most popular books.

You will then contact the intended school principal and explain the project. If permission is granted, you will obtain the number of third-graders in the school. Once the dictionaries are ordered and in your possession, schedule a visit and distribute them personally to the students. This is the fun part!

Let the students and teachers know that the books are a gift to them from your Lodge. Many Lodges personalize the dictionaries with an Elks Lodge name label. Keep your visit short and to the point. It will be a visit that you will never forget!

If you don't want to do the Dictionary Project, the school you have contacted wants to keep things paperless or already has a similar project, what can we do to help our youth? A program called Kits for Kidz offers school supply kits that contain 30 essential, age-appropriate items that will last the entire school year, check it out online. Remember: "Uks Care - Uks Share."







Software aimed at giving BPOE edge in reaching public

Grand Lodge has another tool in its tool chest to spread the word about the BPOE to the public.

MEMBERSHIP That tool – business intelligence software – is now being rolled out from Grand Lodge to assist Local Lodges in reaching, not just the media outlets they seek, but the actual media contacts who would be most likely to write about the Elks.

The software is the service of the San Francisco-based online media

intelligence company, Meltwater, of which Grand Lodge is now a subscriber.

Meltwater provides Grand Lodge with the names and contact information

of what is referred to as media "Influencers," whom we can target with our articles.

For example, if your Lodge has an article about a veterans event, instead of sending that press release out to a paper's

general media mailbox, and hoping it finds its way to someone who cares or will write about veterans, we can now

send that article directly to the reporter on that paper who usually writes about veterans. We can do that because we now have that reporter's name and direct upto-date contact information.

Please note that Meltwater data is routed through Grand Lodge and not directly to Lodges. Grand Lodge has just begun sharing this information with our Lodges, so look for it and please put it to good use – just another way Grand Lodge is working hard to support your Lodge.
