ELKS NATIONAL FOUNDATION (ENF) Have you had an occasion to ask yourself – why should I buy this raffle ticket to help ENF? Thought you might be interested in a little update. In 2022-23 Lodge Year VT Elks donated \$44,930.68 to the ENF. This year the Foundation will give back to VT \$98,470.00. A ratio of \$2.192 for every dollar donated. These funds help support Drug Awareness, Hoop Shoot, Soccer Shoot, Community Investments (Grants), MVS Scholarships, Legacy Award, Emergency Educational Grants for children of deceased or totally disabled Elks, and Veterans. Our Lodge alone has applied for grants totaling \$9,500 which will all be given back to our Communities for various needs and projects In 2022-23, nationwide, more than \$12.1 million was granted to Elk Lodges to help build stronger communities. Every time an Elk volunteers in the community they spread a core of the Order – CHARITY. An hour of volunteer time is worth \$29.95/hour. The more volunteers the higher the overall value of the grant.

Lodge grants: Money donated to date includes: \$1,000 Freedom Grant to VA for Recreation Therapy Program. \$2,000 Reading/W. Windsor Food Shelf; \$2,500 divided up and given to support Rotary/WSESU School Supply Drive, Dictionaries for 3rd graders in 5 surrounding schools, Recreation Center, Windsor Police Dept. Babysitting Course.

ENF SCHOLARSHIP UPDATE. Most Valuable Student Scholarship applications have ended. December 2023 - February 2024 Lodge, District, State Judging. Applicants will be notified via email at each stage of competition by Elks National Foundation. It is responsibility of the applicant to make sure all eligibility and application requirements are met. This includes responding to questions and any required supplemental material such as transcript and FAFSA report. If you have someone applying, please be sure to remind them to follow through. There are however still two other ENF Scholarships available Legacy Awards. These are college scholarships worth \$4,000 and will be awarded to 350 children and grandchildren of Elks members. Eligibility: College-bound high school seniors who are children or grandchildren of dues-paying Elks. Judging Criteria – knowledge, charity, community service, integrity. Service - Legacy scholars are required to serve with the Elks throughout college to receive their scholarship funds. Deadline: Due online on or before February 5, 2024. scholarship@elks.org or elks.org/scholars Emergency Educational Grants. Eligibility: Attend an accredited U.S. college or university as a full-time (12 semester hours) undergraduate student. Demonstrate financial need.
