## Did you know?

The Elks are the second-largest provider of college scholarships in the US! Only the federal government provides more money to help students with financial aid. Several scholarships are available for high school seniors.



Since 1931, the Elks National Foundation has helped students recognize their academic dreams. Each year, we award nearly \$4 million in college scholarships to at least 850 outstanding, service-minded high school seniors. Once you're an Elks scholar, you're family. Our Elks scholar family is 17,000 strong, with 3,000 active scholars attending 65 unique U.S. institutions.

Scholarships are available for undergraduate students, regardless of whether they have an affiliation with the Elks. The process begins by the local lodge reviewing submissions and passing them to the district. Those that pass the district level go to the state.

- The Esteemed Loyal Knight, Troy Lynn Betanbaugh, is the second vice president. Her station represents justice.
- The Esteemed Lecturing Knight, Robert Marshall, is the third vice president. His station represents brotherly love.
- The ER represents the fourth principle – fidelity.

Each knight is a member of the board of directors.

What do you do at the lodge?

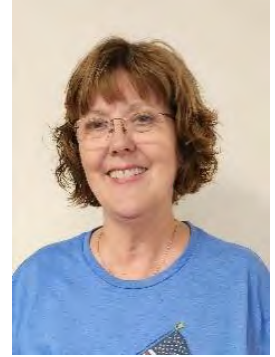

## Texas Children's Elks Camp History

*This is the second in a series of articles about the camp (also known as Ottine).*

Founded in 1937, Warm Springs Rehabilitation System began as the Gonzales Warm Springs Foundation for Crippled Children, focused on helping children affected by polio. The organization grew from access to the Gonzales springs in 1939 to a 16-bed inpatient facility by 1941, becoming a major force in pediatric polio care by 1947. After the Salk vaccine reduced polio cases in the 1950s, Warm Springs shifted its mission to serve people of all ages with physical disabilities.

Although it faced a financial crisis in the early 1960s, the community, including previous children who were polio survivors, helped save it and led to the creation of the Warm Springs Rehabilitation Foundation. The system later expanded to San Antonio and Corpus Christi, built outpatient networks, earned major accreditations, and now provides therapies including physical, speech, recreational, vocational, and occupational therapy.

The evolution of the Texas Elks Camp has taken many twists and turns. Currently the Camp helps more than 280 children during the seven sessions each year who would not have the opportunity to receive support they receive had it not been for the desire of a few people to help children.

Knowing that a place like Texas Elks Camp exists in Gonzales, contributing so significantly to the well-being and development of Texas youth, particularly those facing unique challenges, makes it a true highlight for our state. It embodies the Texan spirit of generosity and community support, offering a place where every child can thrive and feel like they truly belong. For local families, it's not just a camp; it's a lifeline of support, an opportunity for growth, and a source of immeasurable happiness for our children.

Next month, we will go into the more current uses of the camp and the opportunities to help.
