When Jim Elamon(PER), Chairman of the Board of Directors, asked me if I would like to be a Trustee for the Lodge, my immediate response was Yes!



The Women's Auxiliary group of the Flat Rock Elks 1731 known as "Elkadys" was founded back 1948. Although complete records are not available, it is estimated that it began with around 50 to 55 members. Membership grew to 102 in 1970 and is currently at 47 (including 11 honorary members). The longest serving member is Ila Mae Brehmer who joined in 1958 (president 1964/1965).

I had the opportunity to read through some of the old meeting minutes and saw that times were a little different back then, as you can imagine. One interesting thing we found was back in 1969, a rule was passed that only member's wives were eligible. If you became widowed while a member, you were no longer eligible. That rule changed in 1973 to allow wives & widows. While they have evolved over the years, some things like the Christmas party have been done from the beginning. The Elkadys are often working behind the scenes and you may not realize all the events that they have organized. Just to name a few of the current events: Annual Soup Cook-off, Paint Party, Third Thursday Dinners, Christmas Dinner and Quartermania. Wine & Paint Party – An art instructor teaches a small group of potential artists to paint a picture. The cost is \$40. Supplies, wine and snacks are included. Quartermania - This was introduced in November of 2013 and has been a huge success! It's held 3 times a year: Valentine's Day, Mother's Day and Halloween. Vendors and members donate items to make the baskets that are used for the raffle. This event is a blast! Ladies - if you have not attended one, grab a friend or two or three and make a plan to attend the next one!!!

Although it's never an event that anyone would look forward to, the Elkadys organize and prepare food for the funeral lunches. You may or may not know that funeral lunches are a benefit of being an Elk member. The hall and the first \$200 towards food are donated by the lodge (\$150 for Elkadys).

There are so many things their fundraising efforts have either contributed to or enabled us to purchase throughout the years - too many to list them all, but some of those are: a new dishwasher for the kitchen, a glass cleaner for the downstairs bar, carpeting and tile upstairs and downstairs, repaired the freezer upstairs, a new freezer downstairs, cameras and monitor for the building, the running sign outside, barstools, television, new light fixtures in the hall, and a new roof over the upstairs bar. When repairs or equipment are badly needed, they have stepped up to the plate to make it happen with the funding needed.

They are also committed to helping our community. Our lodge was #1 in the state for 11 out of 12 years consecutively. Contributions by the Elkadys were added to our lodge total and without their part we probably would not have made #1 all those years. Clearly, over the years this group has made a significant difference to our lodge. If you haven't done so already, be sure to give their members a well-deserved thank you for all

If you are a spouse of a current member and want to get involved, the cost is \$10. Contact an officer or just come to a meeting. The meetings are held on the 4th Wednesday of the month. Come and be a part of the Elkadys and make some new friends. Don't want to become a member right now? That's ok. But they could always use a hand: help with funeral lunches (donate desserts or help cook the meal), decorating the hall for the Christmas party, or help prepping for other events. Even if it's only a couple of hours, they welcome any help you can offer.

## Flat Rock Elk's receives 2 Awards

At Elk's State Convention.

During the Michigan State Elk's Convention last month we received two second place awards for Flat Rock Elk's Lodge #1731.

Michigan Elk's Association, Major Project Commission's first award was for our 356 Donations of \$6,519.54 and a second award for a Lodge Overall Donation of \$7,981.54.

Thanks to everyone that worked so hard on these special events and projects.....

What is Major Project and what do we do? Well Major Project is a requirement by Grand Lodge that every state in the U.S.A. choose a charitable cause that will help and assist people or organizations. In Michigan, our cause is Special Needs Children. Other states have different focuses such as Indiana that funds cancer research.

Yearly, each member of the Elks gives \$1.00 from their annual dues to Major Project to help fund this terrific program. That equates to around \$20,000.00 annually. Major Project budgets about \$350,000.00 for each fiscal year to provide therapies, specialized medical devices, camps, learning devices and a host of other programs to help these children with their daily struggles. We focus on proven therapies that will give these individuals a fighting chance to be productive members of society. We provide funding to 20 camps around the state that teach these kids how to deal with their specific issues. Annually, we send about 300 kids. We also fund around 100 cases for specialized equipment and learning devices. In total that is 400 individuals that receive assistance from Major Project.

So, if we get \$20,000.00 annually from our members, where do we get the other \$330,000.00 from? Our lodges get involved with a large array of fundraising events. We do golf outings, dinners, polar plunges, bowling, ball games, and the list goes on. The individual lodges choose what they believe will work for the members in their lodges and they roll with it. Additionally, every lodge has purple banks. The intent when it was first started was to put a penny a day into your own bank and 365 days later turn them in. That is where the 365 comes from. In todays world, we ask that they put in a quarter a day. We also receive funding from organizations such as Exxon Mobile, Kroger's, Spartan Nash, State Farm and other local merchants. We also receive about \$50,000.00 annually for the Elks National Foundation who is the funding arm of Grand Lodge.

This program is overseen by 6 commissioners, 1 from each district in our state. Additionally, the State President, the 1st Vice President and the 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President are on this commission as well. We have an office in Grand Rapids where our Executive Director is. She is a full-time employee and she handles all day to day operations and any thing that the commissioners require of her.

We are a tax exempt 501c3 organization.



## On May 11, 2018 Flat Rock Lodge proudly hosted its annual Most Valuable Student award dinner.

This is held in connection with a nationwide program sponsored through Grand Lodge. Each Lodge recognizes the top three achieving young women and the top three achieving young men in their community. At our Lodge, we provide each of the six students with \$500 scholarships and advance them through District, State and National level judging where they can be eligible for up to \$60,000 in scholarships.

Although our scholarship is officially known as the "Most valuable Student" scholarship, I personally feel it should be identified as the "Most valuable person" scholarship because the criteria for selection go well beyond scholarship. All applicants are judged on eight separate merit based standards including excellence in the classroom; excellence on standardized tests; leadership skills; community service; employment activities; athletics and extracurricular activities; and the all-important essay. To win one of our awards the student must be an intelligent, caring, well rounded young adult who has been placed in leadership roles by his or her peers. Our scholarship winners represent the three highest achieving young men and three highest achieving young women from throughout our community which includes 17 different private and public high schools covering all of Monroe county and a large portion of Southern Wayne County. They include five out of six students maintaining at least a 4.0 GPA with most of them much higher than that. It includes a student who is a two time State champion wrestler and who also earned all-american status. It includes a Valedictorian as well as a student who will be attending the highly prestigious MIT University this Fall. Most importantly, it includes six fine young men and women who have served their communities and fellow students through multiple charitable activities and leadership roles at their schools.

The competition in our Lodge alone was very rigorous. Three of our six students advanced through District level competition to the State Level and one of them was an award winner at the State Level and advanced to National scoring. This is a group we should all be proud of.

The evening was a great success as our Lodge officers had the opportunity to meet with the scholars and their families and share an evening of awards, conversation and great food. The success of the entire program is shared by many volunteers who helped prepare and serve the dinner and make sure everyone's needs were attended to. I thank all who attended that evening and participated in the event. Special thanks go out to the Members of the Scholarship Committee who took valuable time away from their busy holiday schedules back in December to evaluate and score dozens of applications. Those Members are Carol Wallace, Tammy Steffen and Brian Marvaso. Without their help, the program would not be possible.

## Elk's Flag Day Ceremony

## Saturday - June 9th at 1:00pm

The History Of Flag Day



Join us in finding out the history of these **American Flags** 











The Fourth of July was traditionally celebrated as America's birthday, but the idea of an annual day specifically celebrating the Flag is believed to have first originated in 1885. BJ Cigrand, a schoolteacher, arranged for the pupils in the Fredonia, Wisconsin Public School, District 6, to observe June 14 (the 108th anniversary of the official adoption of The Stars and Stripes) as 'Flag Birthday'. In numerous magazines and newspaper articles and public addresses over the following years, Cigrand continued to enthusiastically advocate the observance of June 14 as 'Flag Birthday', or 'Flag Day'.

In 1894, the governor of New York directed that on June 14 the Flag be displayed on all public buildings. With BJ Cigrand and Leroy Van Horn as the moving spirits, the Illinois organization, known as the American Flag Day Association, was organized for the purpose of promoting the holding of Flag Day exercises. On June 14th, 1894, under the auspices of this association, the first general public school children's celebration of Flag Day in Chicago was held in Douglas, Garfield, Humboldt, Lincoln, and Washington Parks, with more than 300,000 children participating.

The idea of a Flag Day Service was first suggested to our Order by the then Grand Exalted Ruler at the 1907 Grand Lodge Session in Philadelphia. Of the dates submitted for consideration at that time, June 14th was adopted by the session and was called "Elks Flag Day." The following year, in Dallas, the Grand Lodge approved a ritual for the Flag Day ceremony. The 1911 Grand Lodge session at Atlantic City made the observance of Flag Day mandatory for Subordinate Lodges by the adoption of Section 229 of the Statutes: It shall be the duty of each Subordinate Lodge to hold the service known as "Flag Day Services" at the time and in the manner prescribed by the ritual of the Order.

Franklin K. Lane, Secretary if the Interior, delivered a 1914 Flag Day address in which he repeated words he said the flag had spoken to him that morning: "I am what you make me; nothing more. I swing before your eyes as a bright gleam of color, a symbol of yourself."

Inspired by these three decades of state and local celebrations, Flag Day - the anniversary of the Flag Resolution of 1777 - was officially established by the Proclamation of President Woodrow Wilson on May 30th, 1916. While Flag Day was celebrated in various communities for years after Wilson's proclamation, it was not until August 3rd, 1949, that President Truman, himself a member of the Elks, signed an Act of Congress designating June 14th of each year as National Flag Day. The Elks were the first fraternal organization to celebrate Flag Day, and made this ceremony mandatory years before the date on which the observance became a nation-wide practice by legal decree.
