
Remember to bring your friends and family to the lodge. Lets build our membership, we can do great things if we work together.

Sean Pringle Stacks Elks Scholar Accolades

In a thank-you video submitted to the Elks National Foundation after he joined the Elks family as a 2010 Most Valuable Student scholarship recipient, Sean Pringle pledged to join the Elks. Five years later, he made good on his promise and joined his sponsoring Lodge, Oceano/Five Cities, Calif., Lodge No. 2504. Now, he's been named the 2019 Alum of the Year.

While earning both his bachelor's and master's degrees in civil engineering at Cal Poly, Sean embraced the Elks and his fellow Elks scholars. He joined the Scholar Advisory Board and began building a bridge between Elks scholars and Lodges, leading to his next journey into Elkdom.

"After serving on the advisory board, going on service trips, and seeing all the projects the Elks were doing, it really inspired me," Sean shares. "So, I joined the Lodge."

While the Elks helped make Sean's dream of becoming a civil engineer come true—he's currently a Journey Engineer at the Pacific Gas and Electric Company—he continues to be a vocal supporter of the Elks and the Order. And he's backing up his words with action. Sean serves as the Scholarship Chair for his Lodge and District, and he also gives back to the ENF as a member of the Fidelity Club.

"There's a motto I loved learning back when I first started working on the Scholar Advisory Board," Sean shares. "We were told Elks Lodges are places where 'neighbors come together, families share meals and children grow up.' As an Elks member, this statement speaks so true to our Order."

Sean received a \$500 grant to the charity of his choice, and he's chosen the Purple Pig, California-Hawaii Elks Association's major project aimed at addressing the unmet needs of children with disabilities.

Looking ahead, Sean is eager to continue providing service to his community and to the Order, "as an Elks scholar and an Elks member."

Liam was born at Clovis Community Hospital after an uneventful pregnancy. However, just hours after birth Liam went into respiratory distress and was transferred to the neonatal intensive care unit at the hospital until his discharge home 8 days later. Fast forward a few months and Liam's parents began noticing that he was not meeting some typical developmental milestones such as controlling his head, rolling or crawling. Liam also began having seizures. It would be a long road of evaluations by different specialists until last May when Liam was diagnosed with a rare neurodevelopmental disorder due to a genetic gene mutation on the RHOBTB

gene. This gene mutation had just recently been discovered in January 2018 and published in The American Journal of Human Genetics.

Liam began physical therapy when he was six months old. Living in rural Mariposa County with limited resources Liam's family had to travel an hour each way to a clinic in Fresno so Liam could receive physical and occupational therapy. Liam's physical therapist at the time recognized that this long travel time to get to therapy was very draining for Liam. This therapist referred Liam to The California-Hawaii Elks Major Project. If there was ever a child that needed and would benefit from in home therapy services it was Liam. The Elks stepped in and made this possible for Liam through all of their generous donations. Liam initially began occupational therapy with an emphasis on feeding and then began physical therapy when he was just over two years old with The Major Project's physical therapist, Lea Nibur.

When Lea first met Liam he was very limited physically. He could not control his head or even sit up on his own. Lea and Liam worked very hard in therapy focusing on strengthening, balance and floor mobility. Liam is now rolling, army crawling and he loves to play under his bed. During therapy sessions Liam is now able to sit, hold his head up and get into a hands and knees position, all with just a little help. When physical therapy first started Liam would tire very easily and become fussy quickly. Liam

is now all smiles and laughs during therapy sessions. Liam communicates with facial expressions, hand gestures and even gives a thumbs up to let us know that he is happy. He signs "I love you" to his mother. Liam is surrounded by a very loving and supportive family. He enjoys spending time in his stander in the family room with his adoring grandparents. He also loves afternoon with his cousins who sing and play games with him after school. Even the mention of "the girls", Liam's cousins, puts a big smile on Liam's face.

Liam has made very good gains in strength and endurance and has begun going to school for a few hours each week. His whole family is involved in therapy and help Liam practice his new skills. Liam delights us all with his quiet but mighty inner strength and determination. It has been a blessing for Liam to have in home therapy sessions through The California-Hawaii Elks Major Project.


