


January Vic and crew will be starting up the great **Fish Fry** Friday. Please make your reservations early. The success of this event has been a sell out each month.

PROPOSED BY-LAWS CHANGES

ARTICLE X: FEES AND DUES

(b) REGULAR LODGE DUES

All lodge dues hereafter specified shall be payable: annually, in advance, on or before April 1 of each year.

The regular lodge dues shall be \$110.00 per year, which shall not include the Grand Lodge per capita fee, the Grand lodge per capita insurance assessment, and State Associate dues.

“TO BE AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS”:

(b) REGULAR LODGE DUES

All lodge dues hereafter specified shall be payable: annually, in advance, on or before April 1 of each year

The regular Lodge Dues shall be \$119.50 per year which shall not include the Grand Lodge per capita fee, the Grand Lodge per capita insurance assessment, and State Associate dues.

**ATTENTION ALL ELKS: IMPORTANT SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION**

\*\*\* The 2019 Legacy Awards Scholarship Competition for college-bound high school seniors who are children and grandchildren, step-children and step grandchildren and/or a legal ward of Elk members in good standing began on September 1. The Elk member must have joined the Elk's before April 1st of 2017. These merit based scholarship awards are in the amount of \$1,000 per year. Applications are available on-line at [enf.elks.org/leg](http://enf.elks.org/leg). The applicant must take the SAT or Act no later than Dec. 31st. Applications must be submitted on-line on or before January 31st, 2020, 11:59 a.m. Central Time .

\*\*\*Emergency Educational Grants provide undergraduate financial assistance to children of deceased or totally disabled Elks in the form of renewable, one-year grants of up to \$4,000 . Student must attend an accredited U.S. college or university full time (12 semester hours), demonstrate financial need, be unmarried and under the age of 23 as on December 31st in the year of application. Applications are available by request between May 1 and October 31 of the academic year for which assistance is desired. To obtain the application, contact ENF Scholarship Office at 773-755-4732 or [scholarship@elks.org](mailto:scholarship@elks.org) . \*\*\*VOCATIONAL GRANTS. (Occupational or Technical Training). (Grants of up to \$2,000 are awarded in California and Hawaii.) Applications are online at [www.chea-elks.org](http://www.chea-elks.org) (Click on Youth Activities, then select Scholarships and scroll down.)

\*\*\*UNDERGRADUATE SCHOLARSHIPS FOR STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES. This program is a financial need based and academic use scholarship. It is intended for undergraduate work at a licensed vocational school, accredited community college or four year college. **A Lasting Legacy**

Scholarship-seeking season comes to an end on January 31 when the Legacy Award application closes. Legacy Awards are available to high school seniors who are the children and/or grandchildren of dues-paying Elks who joined the Order on or before April 1, 2017, or are charter members of a Lodge that was instituted on or after April 1, 2017.

Each Legacy Awards recipient will receive a \$4,000 scholarship distributed over the course of their college career.

“This award means so much to me because I’ve seen how much my grandparents enjoy being Elks, and I look forward to getting involved,” says Erin Murphy, a 2019 Legacy scholar sponsored by Inverness, Fla., Lodge No. 2522.

Legacy Awards scholars are required to serve with the Elks once per year. Legacy scholars can get involved by rebounding at a Hoop Shoot contest, assisting with Lodge-run projects or Community Investments Program grant projects. The chances for Legacy scholars to serve with their community and learn about the Elks are endless.

Timothy Wilbert, a 2019 Legacy scholar, volunteered with Louisville, Ky., Lodge No. 8—his sponsoring Lodge—and Frankfort, Ky., Lodge No. 530 to take veterans fishing, one of his favorite hobbies.

“It is a great feeling to help others do what you love to do,” Timothy says. “Serving with the Elks taught me compassion.”
