In January Bocce League will begin again so start putting your teams together now. Depending on how many sign up will depend on whether we have 2 or 4 person teams.

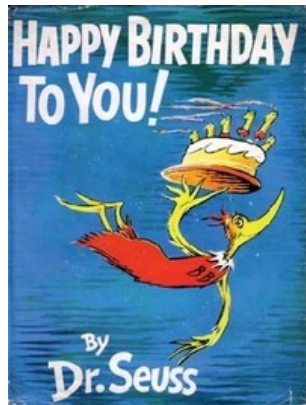

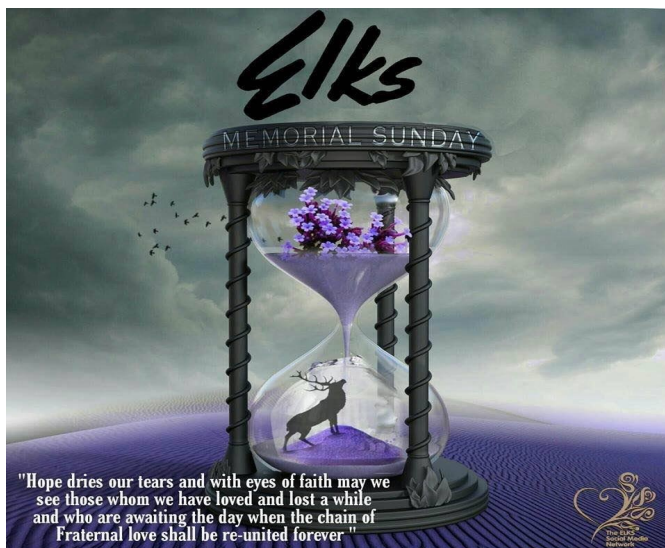

## Laradon CEA State Major Project by Gina Frank

### COLORADO ELKS ASSOCIATION (CEA) STATE MAJOR PROJECTS

This is the 2nd of 3 articles about the three CEA State Major Projects. The 2nd program is Laradon. In the next issue will be information about the Youth Camp.

#### Laradon's Mission

Laradon's Mission is to be an organization of excellence that provides superior, individualized services to children and adults with intellectual, developmental, and other disabilities, supporting their independence in daily life and maximizing their full potential.

#### Laradon's History

In 1948, at a time when the public school system denied an education to their two sons because they were

"mentally retarded," Joseph and Elizabeth Calabrese invested their life savings into the creation of a very special school-Laradon. Named after their two sons, Larry and Don, Laradon was the first charitable organization in the Rocky Mountain region to offer support, education, and training to children with developmental disabilities.

Laradon quickly gained national recognition and referrals increased dramatically, need for a new school was realized. The Colorado Elks were a driving force in securing the current facility at 5100 Lincoln Street in northwest Denver.

In partnership with parents, professionals, philanthropic organizations and generous community members, Joseph and Elizabeth Calabrese created a training

center for people seeking the opportunity to expand their work skills, a school for children with special needs and housing for people in need of a home. The Calabrese's knew that when provided with the proper education, training and support, people with disabilities could realize their full potential, contribute to the community and become valued members of society.

Laradon is a top resource for school districts today and families looking for individual interventions for school age children. The ratio at the school is about 1:3 teacher to student with some clients receiving one on one. Today the Colorado Elks play a major role by donating school supplies and by funding special programs which are not covered by state funding.

The Golden Elks usually sponsor an annual dinner with proceeds benefiting Laradon. In addition, Wayne Rogers currently is a member of the Laradon Foundation Board. Our members donate school supplies and donate items for the annual Laradon Silent Auction normally held at the Colorado Elks Spring Quarterly meeting.

dropped off school supplies for them also.

Oct. 25th we hosted the CNW District workshop via zoom as Wayne is the President of the group this year.
