Greetings from the Capital Facility Improvement Committee.

Sisters & Brothers:

As most of you are aware, we are dealing with a wonderful problem at our Lodge. A conservative estimate indicates our membership can reach 700-750 members in 5 years. As membership continues to increase, we are simply outgrowing our present space.

In 2019, ER Rick commissioned an ad hoc committee to research possible off-sight solutions to our congestion situation. Properties that were toured included the original clubhouse at Falcon Ridge, the building adjacent to the Wolf Creek clubhouse, the market building on Mesquite Blvd., and the clinic building on Hafen Ave. While each property had its share of pluses, there were also issues, mostly including re-modeling costs. The committee basically recommended that constructing our own building would better suit our future needs.

Our current situation is not unprecedented. Recall that we chartered in the small building on Sandhill, then moved to the house at our current location, then expanded that property as well. Each decision to expand was predicated by the same circumstances we are presently experiencing. Thanks to our Founding Sisters and Brothers, each decision set us up to deal with continued growth. Here we are, deja vu all over again. (Thanks, Yogi Berra!)

In late 2020, ER Jim commissioned another temporary committee to research options for expansion. ER Kris extended the committee for his term. We have been meeting regularly and have developed some base recommendations for new construction. We also have many more questions than answers. The bottom line is, we need input from the entire membership to give us the direction to proceed.

To that end, mark your calendars for a "Town Hall" meeting at 10:00 am on October 16, 2021, at the Lodge. We will present thoughts and ideas developed to this point and solicit information from the membership as well. A follow-up session will be held at the Lodge at 10:00 am November 6, 2021.

Message from the GER - T. Keith Mills

Elks keep moving forward and Meeting the Challenge

Wow, what a fantastic opportunity to serve our great Order. I would like to first thank my wonderful wife, Amy. Without her love, support, and commitment this experience would not be possible. We both are very grateful to have been chosen to take this incredible journey. I would also like to thank my other family members. Knowing they are helping take care of our personal obligations at home during this time is a huge help to both of us.

My theme this year is "Meeting the Challenge." This past year was like no other in the history of our Order. With the ongoing COVID-19 situation, I want to congratulate local Boards of Directors and members for their efforts in continuing Lodge operations and remaining active in their community. Thank you for taking and showing pride in our Order. Not only could we not meet regularly, but we all experienced a crash course in virtual meetings.

Summer is still upon us, but fall is closing in. Now is the time to begin planning Lodge fall activities. For example, begin working on a school supply program, or start one if one is not available in your community. This is an opportunity to engage with your schools, help children who need it by providing critical school supplies, and lay the groundwork for other Elks youth programs (e.g., Hoop Shoot, scholarships, drug awareness).

This year, my goal for Elks National Foundation will remain at \$4.80 per Member. I know this goal is easily obtainable since we have more than doubled this number for many years now. The stronger your Lodge, the greater benefit to your community. With the various grants from the Elks National Foundation, we can readily add to existing Community Service Projects. Today, our communities need us more than ever. There are always projects that could use our help to strengthen the charitable works we do. For some ENF Grants, your Lodge just needs to apply. Others are competitive. However, ENF personnel are there to assist you with these proposals.

The Elks Most Valuable Student applications are now open and online. Create a little explanation sheet or download one from elks.org. Then call your high school counselors to inform them of our program and where they can direct their seniors for the eligibility requirements and application. Follow up that call with a small letter. Remember we also have the Student/Teenager Month and Year Program. This is one way for your Lodge to recognize high school students for their work and volunteerism. Look into this program within the Grand Lodge Youth Activities Program Manual.

Finally, this week, visit Elks.org. Under the Fraternal Committee, print off the "Patriotism Week Proclamation." Have your city mayor sign it to proclaim September 6-12, 2021 as National Patriotism Week in your town. Then, use this opportunity to encourage new Members to join our great Order.

Thoughts from Debbie Oskin, PER: *Just a reminder that we as Elks members should refrain from discussing Lodge business and finances around the bar and other socializing areas and situations. This may sound like a stuffy outdated idea but there is good reasoning behind it. People often only hear bits and pieces of conversation in noisy rooms, and we all know how easily words can be misunderstood and taken out of context. I've seen friendships destroyed, people seriously hurt and unnecessary trouble created for Lodges due to a few misunderstood or carelessly spoken words. As officers we especially need to be careful where and how we discuss our business because sometimes even a joke from the lips of an officer can be taken seriously or seriously misconstrued. We're here to make friends, look out for one another and do good in our community. Part of our mission is to have the best time possible while achieving our goals. Let's try to keep in mind that Lodge Business is best confined to Lodge Meetings or as someone I knew used to say, "Your opinion isn't worth a dime at the bar, but it may be priceless in a Lodge meeting."*

The history of Patriotism Week

A battle over the Pledge of Allegiance led to the creation of a week-long commemoration of patriotism.

In the late 1970s, 16-year-old Lori Cox of Scottsdale, AZ led a fight to re-institute the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance at her high school. She met quite a bit of resistance but won a short-lived struggle with the local school board to recite the Pledge daily on a volunteer basis. However, after five months, the decision was rescinded due to pressure on the school board from disgruntled students and teachers. The Pledge was limited to a voluntary once-a-week event.

Cox pushed to have a state law to allow the recitation of the Pledge. She wrote to the President and 100 other leaders across the nation to support her idea that would expand to involve all Americans. She then wrote to every congressman and senator in the United States to recognize National Patriotism Week. Part of what she said was “we will be a better people because of pride, and by transmitting those attributes to one another.”

Because of Ms. Cox’s efforts, the week commencing with the third Monday in February 1981 would be known as “National Patriotism Week.” It requested the President to issue a proclamation that called on Americans to recognize the week with appropriate celebrations and observances.

In December 1980, President Jimmy Carter declared a resolution calling for the observance of the week, calling upon all primary and secondary schools to adopt a curriculum which should include such elements as the Pledge of Allegiance; the national anthem; national symbols, seals and mottos; and national monuments, heroes, and accomplishments. He also requested each federal agency recognize that week. President Reagan would also make official proclamations for National Patriotism Week.

At the 1982 Grand Lodge Convention, the Elks enthusiastically endorsed a resolution calling for a National Patriotism Week, citing Lori Cox’s influence.

Patriot Day was made an American national observance in 2002 by President Bush in memory of those killed in the September 11 attacks. President Obama rededicated it in 2009 as Patriot Day and National Day of Service and Remembrance. This day is not a national holiday but the national flag is flown at half-mast on all US government buildings. National Patriotism Week was moved from the third week in February to the second week in September in 2008.

So what is Patriotism? It is commonly defined as the love of and attachment to one’s own country. It also encompasses devotion and robust support for the nation. Patriotism promotes peace and harmony.

How do we promote or demonstrate Patriotism? This can be as simple as holding a moment of silence for our departed or the heroes of our nation. It can be a complex event such as a flag waving parade and speeches. Simply flying our nation’s flag, holding a ceremony, or standing during the playing of our national anthem are other examples of patriotism. There is no limit except for your imagination
