

## Community projects give back—and lure new Members

How are you doing with your Lodge Community Projects? Did you know that you can enter your Lodge into the Community Project Contest offered by the Grand Lodge Activities Committee? Visit the Grand Lodge Activities Committee on elks.org to see what is needed to get your Lodge some additional recognition. If you have done some projects, fantastic. If not, it is not too late to begin now. This is a great way for your membership to get involved outside the Lodge. Who knows, it may interest new Members for your Lodge.

October 23-31 is Red Ribbon Week. This is our nation's oldest and largest drug prevention program, reaching millions of Americans every year. The Federal Drug Enforcement Administration, DEA, and others plan activities throughout the month. Contact local law enforcement and community organizations to see if your Lodge can get involved. In addition,

encourage your Members to wear red ribbons for the month during their daily routine. Pass out red ribbons to your schools, sponsor a red ribbon activity, submit public service announcements supporting your Red Ribbon program to local media. Also, during this time, most DEA agencies sponsor a prescription Drug Take Back Day. Ask a local law enforcement agency if your Lodge can volunteer to help in any way.

Now is the time for your six-month review of your Lodge operations. Lodge Secretaries need to give their bi-annual report on the activities of their office to the membership. Exalted Rulers, if you have not done so, you need to submit to the Lodge floor your report on the Grand Lodge Session. Auditing and Accounting Committees also need to review the Lodge financials and report to the Lodge Members. Finally, make revisions (if necessary) to your annual budgets to get a clearer financial picture of your Lodge and to make decisions moving forward. Keeping your Lodge fiscally strong will ensure you continue "Meeting the Challenge."

In addition to other activities, get started on the American Essay contest at your local schools. The deadline for submission is in mid-December. Information for the essay contest is located in the Grand Lodge Americanism Manual found on the Elks website. Have your Americanism chairperson examine the manual—There are great programs for your Lodge and community, and it provides ways to interact with others outside the Lodge, promote our programs, and find prospective new Members.

Finally, let us not forget Halloween at the end of the month. Think about planning an event for kids or working with another entity to provide a safe and fun opportunity for our youth.

We handle the incoming mail and phone calls. We process the income and expenses of the Lodge, prepare bank deposits, verify bar bags and other receipts that come in. The office is responsible for preparing and filing taxes and financial reports. We interact with our District, Association, and Grand Lodge officers. We are clerk of the forum and handle the processing of judicial matters within our Lodge.

The list can go on and on, but this is the highlights of what the office does. We have close to 780 members and are fortunately growing every month. With this growth, we are busier than ever. Mondays and Tuesdays are especially busy for us: Mondays from the weekend's bar and food sales and Tuesdays with preparing for the Lodge meetings.

With the blessing from the House Committee, we are asking for at least a seven-business day turn around on requests from the office. Members have the right to view all documents and bills and other financial records (except for wages) and are open for viewing by members during regular business hours. You may take manual notes, but you may not photograph, make copies of, or take files outside of the Lodge. As mentioned previously, Monday and Tuesday are the busiest days and while we cannot restrict, we ask you work with us and avoid these days. If you need a copy of the Statutes book, of course you don't have to wait unless we need to order it.

Lastly, in August we added a second Office Assistant, Audry Johnson, to our Lodge office staff. Michelle Muniz and I are happy she is on board. The next time you are in the Lodge, please stop by and say hello. I would also like to thank Gloria Steck who has helped with so many hours in the office while we were looking for an Office Assistant.

#### A Message from Scholarship Chair, LINDA REDGRIFT

The Elks National Foundation (ENF) 2022 scholarship year is still open. Here are the details!

#### Most Valuable Student (MVS) Contest

The Most Valuable Student scholarship is available to high school seniors who are United States citizens and pursing a four-year degree. Applicants do not need to be related to a member of the Elks. Applicants are judged on academics, leadership, community service and financial need.

The application is completed online at enf.elks.org/MVS and must be submitted by the deadline, November 15, 2021. The 500 national winners will be announced in April 2022. The ENF will award 20 top scholarships ranging from \$20,000 to \$50,000. The top 20 national finalists participate in the Leadership Weekend and interview for the top awards. The remaining 480 runners-up will receive \$4,000 scholarships.

This year, the Elks National Foundation is investing \$4.2 million in college scholarships. We've invested wisely. MVS scholars—all of whom demonstrate outstanding leadership skills and a commitment to service—are graduating from college at a rate of 90 percent, 30 percent higher than the national average.

#### **Legacy Awards**

The Legacy Awards program began on September 1 and the application deadline is February 7, 2022. Legacy Awards provide \$4,000 scholarships each year for children and grandchildren of duespaying Elk members. The ENF offers a total of 350 national awards. Please visit <a href="mailto:enf.elks.org/Leg">enf.elks.org/Leg</a> for more details and the application link.

#### **Emergency Education Grants**

Educational Emergency Grants provide undergraduate college financial assistance to children of deceased or totally disabled Elks. They are renewable one-year grants up to \$5,000. Applications are available between May 1 and November 1 of the academic year for which the assistance is desired.
