A Message from Leading Knight, ELIZABETH DYE, PER

Brothers and Sisters.

As we approach Veterans Day, I would like to briefly share a bit of historical significance of that date.

World War I was also known as "The Great War" and officially ended when the Treaty of Versailles was signed on June 28, 1919. However, fighting ceased seven months earlier when an armistice, or temporary cessation of hostilities went into effect on the **eleventh hour** of the **eleventh day** of the **eleventh month**. For that reason,

November 11, 1918, is generally regarded as the end of "the war to end all wars."

In November 1919, President Wilson proclaimed November 11 as the first commemoration of Armistice Day with the following words: "To us in America, the reflections of Armistice Day will be filled with solemn pride in the heroism of those who died in the country's service and with gratitude for the victory, both because of the thing from which it has freed us and because of the opportunity it has given America to show her sympathy with peace and justice in the councils of the nations..." May 13, 1938, made the 11th of November in each year a legal holiday dedicated to the cause of world peace and to be known as "Armistice Day." Armistice Day was primarily a day set aside to honor Veterans of World War I, but in 1954, World War II required the greatest mobilization of Soldiers, Sailors, Marines and Airmen in the Nation's history just after American forces fought the aggression in Korea, so at the urging of the Veteran's service organizations, the 83rd Congress amended the Act of 1938 and replaced "Armistice" with "Veterans." November 11th became a day to honor American veterans of ALL wars.

To honor ALL Veterans, we ask that you join us on November 11th at 1 pm in Veterans Park for a Ceremony organized by the Redondo Beach Veterans Task Force followed by a BBQ hosted by our Lodge at 2 pm.

Remember, "So long as there are Veterans, the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks will never forget them".

Peter William Vasilion passed away at his home



surrounded by his adoring wife, loving children and grandchildren on June 8, 2021 – a month shy of his 91st birthday. Peter is survived by his wife, Tina, his two children Bill Vasilion and Maria Peters and five grandchildren: Peter, Christina,

Andrew, Matthew and Natalie.

Peter was born in Los Angeles, California on July 19, 1930 to William Vasilion and Mary Carvelas. Peter grew-up in Los Angeles and moved to the South Bay in his early years where he attended school in Hermosa Beach and graduated from Redondo Union High School. Upon High School graduation, Peter was drafted into the United States Army and was deployed to South Korea where he served as a member of the Army Finance Corp.

Upon Peter's return from the Korean War, he was invited by a family friend – Albert Corsaro, to put his newly acquired finance skills to work at his beverage distributorship in the South Bay. What started as a small business in Redondo Beach grew

to a prominent South Bay business with a custom built warehouse and over fifty employees. Peter would eventually take over the business - forever known as Corsaro Distributing in honor of Albert Corsaro.

Peter raised his family in Palos Verdes Estates and was blessed to live within minutes of his entire family. Peter took great pride in his involvement in his beloved Saint Katherine Greek Orthodox Church in Redondo Beach where he was a founding member and enjoyed the many life-long friendships that fellowship created.

Peter was forever social. He loved people and was known for his vibrant demeanor. He enjoyed sharing stories with each of his grandchildren about the old time characters of the South Bay and the personalities he met through the beer business. He had a special relationship with each one of them and was always ready to share his Papou wisdom on leading a meaningful life.

SENIOR BENEFITS

SENIOR PARKING METER PERMIT: If you are 62 or older and drive a car currently registered in California, you can purchase a parking meter permit for \$25.00.
