





Next chapter for your Lodge starts this month

First, congratulations to all newly installed Exalted Rulers and Lodge officers. Thank you for making the commitment and accepting the duties and responsibilities of the office for which you have been chosen. You are about to take part in—I hope—one of the greatest experiences in your Lodge career, becoming a Lodge officer. Do not take this experience and responsibility lightly. By accepting your office, you will guide the direction your Lodge will pursue for the next Lodge year and continue "Meeting the Challenge."

Newly elected Exalted Rulers need to reach out to committee appointees to ensure they are prepared to perform their assignments. Show them how to get the information for their committee on elks.org. It is your job to help remove obstacles they may encounter along the way to better perform their duties. Make sure they report all charitable hours and mileage to the Lodge Secretary so they may be entered into CLMS.

One suggestion is to assign important committees to different chair officers to oversee and ensure committees are working to the best of their ability. Then, during your monthly officer meeting or Lodge meeting, have committee chairs or chair officers give updates on that committee.

In relation to finances, the budget(s) for your Lodge should be ready to be presented to the membership for approval before the last regular Lodge meeting in April. The Annual Report for the previous year is also due May 1. Make sure that your Financial Reporting System (FRS) is up to date and be sure to submit your

end of year financials to your accounting personnel so they may prepare your 990s and 990Ts for your Lodge shortly after April 1. Once completed, you will need to upload them to elks.org and file them with the Internal Revenue Service.

I know that all Lodges are actively involved in their communities. You are encouraged to establish at least one community project that emphasizes the charitable work of our Order. The Grand Lodge Activities Committee also has a Community Projects Contest. The Committee will award first, second, and third place within the six membership categories. This award will give your Lodge national recognition to show your Lodge is actively supporting your community. You have done the work, now fill out the form and submit before the May 1 deadline.

By this time, your District Deputy Grand Exalted Ruler should have informed you of the place and time for their Spring District Deputy Clinic. This is a great learning opportunity to gather with other officers within your district. It is also the time that your District Deputy will help you and your officers get the year off to a good start.

Finally, good luck to you during this Elks year. Being a Lodge leader has some work involved. However, it can be lots of fun and a truly rewarding experience for you and your Lodge. If you need anything, your Past Exalted Rulers, local District Deputy, state leaders, and other Grand Lodge committee members are there to help and guide you. You just need to ask.

Hello fellow members,

I am happy to report that with our Focus Grant of \$10,000 we were able to support 24 veterans. The grant money was used to purchase requested household items such as small appliances, linens, cleaning supplies, clothes, and beds to help these vets set up their new housing as they transition from homelessness. We worked with 2 organizations, US Vets and 1736 Family Crisis Center's Veteran Families Program. I am writing the final report very soon and plan to submit an article to the Elks Magazine.

We were also able to use our Freedom grant of \$2,500 as a direct donation to the 1736 Family Crisis Center's Veteran Families Program. This money was used to purchase food for veteran families in need. Some of those families we also helped with the Focus Grant.

I would like to thank everyone involved with these programs. It is so rewarding to help those in need. This is what Elks do!

The California-Hawaii Elks Association CHEA is best known for its support of children with disabilities. The Purple Pig - Major Project - CHEMPI, is the fundraising arm of this charitable work and serves as a reminder to the membership that our greatest joy is in giving to and helping others. By filling your Purple Pig with the "A Coin A Day so they can Walk, Talk, See and Play" is one of the many ways to support the children and their families who may have had little hope without the CHEA intervention.

FOOD/KITCHEN COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS



On November 2, 2021, the initial proposed committee members were approved on the floor of the lodge and data was requested to begin the review of the food

service and kitchen management. During the course of the review of available documents, investigation into the average cost of Industry Kitchen Rentals in the area, assessing how food service is being provided in other lodges in the area, and reaching out to other potential companies to outsource food provision to a variety of opportunities to improve were identified. The following are the key recommendations for the provision of food service for our members and guests are listed below:

- Have a key person in charge of the food and beverage service who serves as the "advocate/manager" and monitors compliance with all regulatory requirements for food service (and if outsourced to a vender) the elements of the contract by the food provider as well as the lodge. In addition, serves as the liaison between the food provider, lodge officers and lodge as a whole.
- Establish a routine monitoring tool/checklist to be completed on a monthly basis to ensure all regulatory requirements (and if outsourced) elements of the contract are in compliance with the food provider and the lodge as a whole.

- Cameras in the hallway from the bartender office out the side door as well as from the North Dining Room looking into the kitchen.
- Deep cleaning to be scheduled with an outside provider, by the lodge on a monthly basis to ensure ongoing cleanliness and increase compliance with food safety.
- Coordinated access to the kitchen when as a lodge kitchen access is required.
- Placement of asset tags on all of the equipment of the lodge present in the kitchen.
- If it is decided to outsource the provision of food service, establish a contract and relationship with a food provider that ensures all regulatory compliance is maintained, all required licenses and certifications are in place throughout the term of the contract.
 - Rental of the kitchen to be no less than \$2500/month (including storage – cold and dry).
- Consideration of metering the gas line into the kitchen if food service is outsourced.

The options for provision of food service to be voted on by the members of the lodge at the first meeting of the fraternal year on **Tuesday April 12**, **2022**, are as follows:

- Food service to be provided internally by our members with cooking ourselves or having food brought in by local vendors, that our members/volunteers would serve.
- 2. Food service to be provided internally via hiring our own staff for the provision of food (It is noted that this option would take time to budget for, hire staff, and implement.
- 3. Outsource our provision of Food to Uncle Larry's Cuisine and Catering via contract. See his sample menu below (he plans on running weekly specials for diversity):

Tomato Basil (daily), Chili (daily), Soup of the day (varies daily) \$6

APPETIZERS

Buffalo Wings w/ Ranch or Bleu Cheese \$10 Fried Vegetables w/ Ranch or Bleu Cheese \$10 Chili Cheese Fries w/ Ranch or Bleu Cheese \$8

SIDES

Garlic Mashed Potatoes, Fries, Green Beans, Baked Beans, Wild Rice, Au Gratin Potatoes (\$1 more), Brussel Sprouts (\$1 more)

ENTREES

Burger w/ Fries \$10
Veggie Burger w/ Fries \$10
Chicken Sandwich (grilled or fried) w/ Fries \$9
Salmon (2 sides) \$16
Fried Shrimp Dinner (2 sides) \$18
Slow cooked BBQ Rib Dinner (2 sides) \$25 full, \$15 half
