

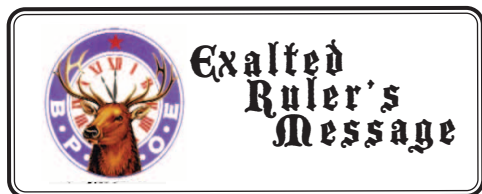

For 2022-23, the Elks National Foundation allocated \$2.8 million to fund the Most Valuable Student scholarship program, which includes 500 four-year scholarships ranging from \$4,000 to \$50,000. Kaden Oqueli-White (sponsored by Slidell, L.A., Lodge 2321) and Breana Fowler (sponsored by Salisbury, N.C., Lodge 699) were the recipients of the top ENF scholarships. They both earned \$50,000 scholarships.

Kaden plans on attending Columbia University to study astrophysics and pursue a career in academia. Though he is focused on the vastness of the cosmos, he seeks to have an impact much closer to home by using his education and experiences to engage diverse populations, specifically encouraging Latino students to pursue STEAM careers.

Breana will start at Spelman College this fall, where she will study education. She hopes to open her own boarding school and to influence education policy and curriculum by becoming the secretary of education, but that is a dream for the future.

Americanism

Throughout the history of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks there have been many famous members including business leaders, political leaders, sports figures, and entertainment celebrities.

The song "**God Bless America**" was written by one of America's greatest songwriters, Irving Berlin, and was introduced on national radio by Kate Smith during her weekly Kate Smith Hour on November 1938, to mark the twentieth anniversary of the Armistice that ended World War I. The song was heard by millions of radio listeners. What most people do not realize is that Irving Berlin was an Elk. He joined New York Lodge No. 1 when he was 40 years of age and remained a proud member until his death at age 104.

Like Elks members then and now, Irving Berlin had no desire to cash in on his patriotism. In 1940 he established the **God Bless America Foundation** with all royalties from the song and its performance earned by either Berlin or Kate Smith going to the Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts of America. That arrangement exists today because, "*The complete non-sectarian work of the Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts is calculated to best promote unity of mind and patriotism, two sentiments that are inherent in the song itself.*"

Irvin Berlin, like all proud Elks, demonstrated even long ago that **Elks Care - Elks Share.**

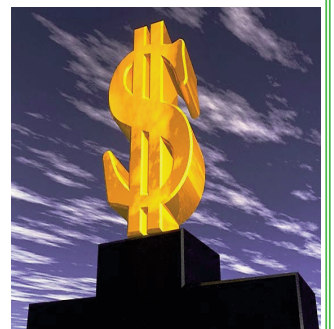
