

You may have received an email from Greg Collins and Bob Myron recently relating to the online volunteer coordination and scheduling tool called Sign Up Genius. This program allows the Lodge to enter events and activities along with a list of potential volunteer roles for each. This would allow our Members to go into the program and sign up to work different events based on their availability. It makes signing up easy and convenient. It reduces redundancy and confusion. The Elks remember September 11 each year and honor all those who lost their lives during these horrific attacks, including the first responders and community members who sought to help the crash victims. In this regard, the Elks have developed a Patriotism Week Proclamation that I encourage all Lodges across our great country

to embrace. The proclamation PDF is located on the Elks website under the Fraternal Committee's programs page. Please take the time to download this very important proclamation. Have your local government officials place it on their agenda to recognize our freedom and to honor our nation.

September is also a time when we wish a very happy birthday to the United States Air Force. The Elks honor you for all of your years of service to our country — thank you. Supporting Veterans During Suicide Prevention Month

September is National Suicide Prevention Month. Suicide prevention is a particular concern for many friends and family members of veterans, and a top priority for VA. One way Elks can help prevent suicide is to be aware of and spread information about the Veterans Crisis Line.

When veterans and their loved ones contact the Crisis Line, a qualified responder will be available to listen, provide free support, and connect you with resources in your area.

In July, the Veterans Crisis Line began transitioning to a new number. Now, veterans and military members can **call 988**, **and press 1** to reach someone trained in crisis intervention and military culture. This new, shorter number was created to be easy to remember and share with veterans who need it.

The previous number,1-800-273-8255 and press 1, will still connect you to the Veterans Crisis Line. The line is also available by chat at veteranscrisisline.net/chat and by text at 838255.

What else can Elks do to support veterans' mental health? Make yourself available as a friend and start a conversation. Resist offering judgment or asking invasive questions.

Instead, let veterans know that you are there for them and

educate yourself about the warning signs that a veteran may need help. Be prepared with knowledge about local resources so you can share phone numbers for support groups or services.

Consult with VA or other professionals for tips about how to address suicide prevention and mental health support in your community.

VA's Center for Development and Civic Engagement (CDCE) provides training for programs like Compassionate Contact Corps, which allows volunteers to connect directly with veterans. The CDCE office may also have other opportunities for Elks to get involved.



Elks Most Valuable Student (MVS) Scholarship Eligibility:

- Current high school seniors, or the equivalent, who are citizens of the United States are eligible to apply.
- Applicants do not need to be related to a member of the Elks.
- High school graduates are not eligible to apply.
- Applicants must be citizens of the United States on the date their applications are submitted; permanent legal resident status does not qualify.

Elks Legacy Scholarship Eligibility:

- For the 2023 contest, any child or grandchild (or step-child, step-grandchild, or legal ward) of a living Elk who joined the order on or before April 1, 2020, or a charter member of a Lodge that was instituted on or after April 1, 2020, is eligible to apply. The Elk must also be a paid-up member through March 31, 2023. Great-grandchildren are not eligible.
- The applicant must be a high school senior.
- The applicant must apply online only. The 2023 Legacy Awards application deadline is February 6, 2023.
- 4. If the applicant's parent and grandparent are both Elk members, the applicant must apply through the parent's Elks Lodge.
- We have waived the standardized test requirement for the 2022 Legacy contest. You do not need to submit ACT and/or SAT scores.
- Students may apply for more than one ENF scholarship; however, they may win only one. In cases where the student wins more than one, we will award the scholarship with the greater value. Students can accept local and state scholarships, which are separate from the awards at the national level.

Legacy Awards may only be applied to accredited US American schools, colleges or universities. (Note: Applicants from Guam, Panama, Puerto Rico and the Philippines may apply Legacy Awards toward schools, colleges or universities in their respective homes.)

There is a lot of money out there to potentially secure for students in this regard. What most people don't know is that New York State has additional scholarship funds available on top of the national scholarships. These funds are somewhat easier to obtain since they are less competitive. It is critical to note that you can't obtain New York State scholarship funds unless you first apply through the Elks National Most Valuable Student scholarship portal.

Please take advantage of this opportunity! Let's get some much needed monies back to our Lodge families. You cannot obtain it if you don't try.
