From the Desk of the Chaplain and News Writer



Hello my fellow members. March has arrived and that means spring is upon us. The month of March is named for the Roman god of war, Mars, because war would begin again after winter. In the early Roman calendar, March (Latin word, Martius) was the

first month of the calendar year. The first day of spring is in March with the vernal equinox. It brings new beginnings. In this calendar the year only had ten months. The winter months were not assigned to any months. The year only lasted 304 days, with 61 days unaccounted for. The Roman King Numa Pompilius introduced January and February. January was added to the beginning of the calendar and February to the end of the Roman calendar in 713BCE (Before Common Era). This addition to the year was based on moon cycles and was 355 days long. This was closer to the solar cycle and the extra ten and a quarter days brought on an occasional extra month here and there. The calendar went through some changes during this time frame. February was moved between January and March making March the third month in 452BCE. "I Martius am! Once first, and now third! To lead the Year was my appointed place; A mortal dispossessed me by a word, And set there Janus with the double face." Written by Henry Wadsworth Longfellow, American poet (1807-82). March is still to this day the first month of the year for most of India. They follow the Hindu calendar which is rather complex. Julius Caesar is credited for making January 1st New Year's Day. New Year's Day was first celebrated on January 1st 45BC. Julius Caesar also reformed the twelve month calendar into the Julian calendar. The names of the months were Martius, Aprilis, Maius, Junius, Quintilis, Sextilis, September, October, November, December and finally Janus and Februarius. Some were named for gods and goddesses and some by numbers. So when January and February were added and moved around, the names September through December no longer coincide with their month number. September meaning seven, October meaning eight and so on. The Julian calendar has a leap year every four years. However, this is too often, and eventually, this calendar was several days out of sync with fixed dates for equinoxes and solstices. Pope Gregory XIII introduced a replacement calendar in 1582. This calendar is the worldwide use for civil purposes. The rules of the Gregorian calendar has three parts. First if the year is evenly divisible by 4 it is a leap year, UNLESS if evenly divisible by 100 it is a normal year, UNLESS, divisible evenly by 400, it is a leap year, so the year 2000 was a leap year. It can get complicated. I'm glad someone figured all this out. I think this was pretty advanced for that time frame, considering we still use it today. This is a little history how March was once the first month of the year and is now the third month of the calendar year.
