Elk Thoughts

Faults, Virtues, and Brotherly Love

At the March 14 Lodge meeting, I addressed a House Committee issue and brought up the motto of our Order, **“The faults of our Members are written upon the sand, their virtues upon the tablets of love and memory.”**

It is a perfect motto for us Elks because all of us are different; all of us have our own faults; and perfection is impossible. Our Lodge, like all other lodges, has challenges—yes, faults—to deal with. We will surely deal with those things.

But here, **I want to take this opportunity to talk about VIRTUES – those things that belong “on the tablets of love and memory.”**

We can all be proud of the recent successes that our Lodge has enjoyed. And those successes have been the product of a team effort by our Lodge officers, PERs, the House Committee, many other committees, and members—all volunteers. This has all happened under capable, hands-on leadership by ER Rich Mayes, working alongside many other Elks—for our Lodge.

For example:

The Lodge has made and continues to make charitable contributions in increasing amounts. We are doing more things for our community, our youth, the needy, and our veterans than ever before. And we continue to be among the leading Lodges in our area for donations to the Elks National Foundation.

There have been continuous and significant capital improvements to our Lodge premises, inside and out; notably the HVAC and big improvements in our lounge and kitchen. *And there is more to come.*

Speaking of the kitchen, I think it is accurate to say that the quality and variety the food we offer to members and guests is better than ever. The same is true the snacks and beverages offered in the lounge.

Grants to our Lodge from the Elks National Foundation and the National Veterans Service Commission were the highest ever in 2022, topping \$11,000. Those grant dollars were all spent for charitable purposes, like feeding the hungry by way of Thanksgiving dinners to needy families; the Food Pantry at Pleasantville Elementary School; and special occasion meals for our Veterans at the VA hospital.

There are more social opportunities, events, and fun things going on at our Lodge than ever before. Look around this newsletter and the Lodge calendar. One very notable success is the variety of Saturday afternoon live music genres along with a special kitchen menu. If you haven't had the pleasure of attending, there is jazz, blues, country, bluegrass and more. You should stop by.

Almost every Friday night there is live music in the lounge. Karaoke is the 4th Friday of every month and I have been known to sing (again, perfection is impossible).

Late last year our Lodge became a Delaware not-for-profit corporation. Every Elk Member is a member of the corporation. Very recently, the corporation acquired ownership of the Lodge property.

These are just a few highlights -- some of the **virtues** for which we can thank our leadership, committees, PERs and so many Elk volunteers--too numerous to mention by name. We can all be proud to be a part of it.

Finally, one more **virtue**. Several months ago, Exalted Ruler Rich Mayes spoke to the Lodge about **Brotherly Love**. His comments were also published in the July 2022 *News and Views*. I think those remarks should be revisited by all of us, and especially this:

“Our Lecturing Knight says -- “Ever practice Brotherly Love.”

Not “sometimes,”

Not “just when you feel like it.”

And while we **EVER Practice Brotherly Love**, remember that **the faults of our Members are written upon the sand...**






