Frackville Elks Representative Wins Regional Shoot

On Saturday March 11, 2023, dignitaries from the Mid-Atlantic Region of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks met in York, Pennsylvania for the 2022-23 Regional Elks Soccer Shoot Contest. Competitors from seven state associations competed in boys and girls categories, divided into age groups (U-8, U-10, U-12, U-14, U-16), totaling ten contests. The state associations participating in the regional contest included Maryland-Delaware-DC, Kentucky, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Pennsylvania, and West Virginia. In order to qualify for and participate in the regional event, the competitor must have been a state champion in their gender category and age division from their respective state.

Jordan Bowers, 15, Branchdale, represented the Pennsylvania Elks State Association and the Frackville Elks Lodge No. 1533 at the Mid-Atlantic Regional Elks Soccer Shoot. He competed in the U-16 Boys Division against competitors from the other six state associations, coming out on top, winning the 1st place trophy. Jordan attends Minersville Area Jr/Sr High School. Way to go Jordan!

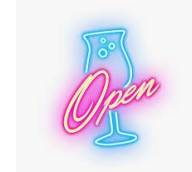

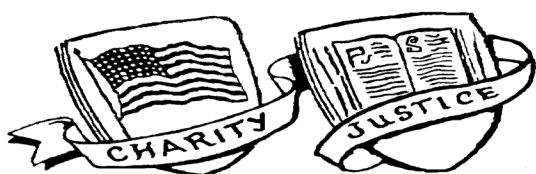

From the Lodge Secretary

I would like to thank you for your confidence in nominating and electing me as your Lodge Secretary for the 2023-24. Previously, I served in this position for five years, from 2016 to 2021. After taking two years off to assume the positions of Vice President and President and perform my duties for the Pennsylvania Elks State Association, I am returning to a very familiar position. I will be working to get back up to speed throughout the months of April and May, so please be patient, but do not hesitate to reach out to me if you have any questions or concerns.

Here are a few things that I will be focusing on during the first two months in the Lodge Secretary position. First, I am working on updating our records in the CLMS system. I would like to compile a list of Lodge members that are Veterans. If you received your membership card in the mail and it *does not* have a Veteran sticker on the card, then you are *not* listed as a Veteran in our CLMS system. This was not done on purpose to offend anyone, nor was it done in error, simply your information was never provided on your "Membership Information Update Form" that is mailed out annually in the month of January. Please notify me right away of your Veteran status and please list the military branch you served in. We must continue to recognize and honor our Veterans.

The second thing that the Lodge Secretary constantly tries to keep up-to-date is the email address of each member. If you have not been receiving the monthly email blast from our previous Lodge Secretary, Jillian, nor the electronic quarterly Lodge newsletter, then you do not have an email address on file. Sending out our Lodge bulletin electronically saved us thousands of dollars in photocopy and mailing supply costs, postage, and bulk mail fees last year alone. We wish to continue this practice and spend the money on our charitable programs and community activities instead.

Finally, my main responsibility, aside from taking meeting minutes each month, is to process all membership dues in a timely manner. I need your help in making sure all of our members are not delinquent in their dues payments, which are due April 1st every year. In the month of April, the Lodge pays all national, state, and district dues on behalf of all members, assuming that everyone has paid their dues to the Lodge. We also pay our taxes, multiple insurance policies, and our license renewals, amounting to thousands of dollars in expenses. So, to be honest, we desperately need our members to pay on time. Dues for regular members are \$70.00 and life membership is \$45.00. We are also graciously asking for your annual donation to our four charitable funds--Elks National Foundation, PA Elks Home Service, Veterans Service, and Youth Activities, which can be sent in with your dues payment, or separately throughout the year. Without your donations, we cannot fulfill all of our charitable obligations.

If you did not send in your Membership Update and Survey Form that was emailed to all members, please do so in a timely manner, so I can add your information to your membership profile in CLMS. Also, I printed paper copies and have them down at the Lodge for your convenience.
