Our 2022-2023 West Des Moines Lodge #2752 Elk of the Year:



Nancy was initiated into our order on May 13<sup>th</sup>, 2002. Her husband, Bill, was a long time member and Nancy wanted to be a member, as well. She quickly became immersed in all things Elks and developed into a faithful and tireless volunteer. She filled the Secretary position at West Des Moines Lodge #2752 from 2007 to 2010 and also served as our chaplain from 2015-2019. Nancy is currently serving the fourth year of a five year term. She is at the Lodge on practically a daily basis and if she is not there, we all wonder why not.

Nancy has been a trail blazer at our Lodge, initiating many new programs and activities. She formed our Tuesday Nine to Fivers Work Group which is made up of several volunteers who meet weekly to perform a variety of behind the scene tasks such as clipping coupons that are sent to military bases overseas, assembling and distributing our newsletter, assembling bingo packets and collecting clothing which is in turn donated to local clothes closets. Nancy is a huge part of our Bingo Program. She attends practically every one of our twice weekly sessions, supervising the volunteers and community service helpers to ensure all goes smoothly. She also manages the monthly bake sales that are held in conjunction with our Sunday breakfasts. In this Elk year alone, the bake sales have brought in over \$5000 which is being donated to charitable organizations in our surrounding communities. Nancy is also the long time chairman of our Lodge Activities Committee, which plans and executes all social events held at West Des Moines Lodge #2752.

Given that both Nancy's father and husband served in the military, veterans hold a special place in her heart. She was integral in the development of our annual Christmas Giving Tree Project where we donate gifts, and gas and grocery cards to needy veterans and their families. In 2022, approximately \$12,000 in goods and monetary donations were given by members and supporters of West Des Moines Lodge #2752 towards this program. This is our largest yearly charitable undertaking and with Nancy's leadership, has grown substantially over the years. She is also involved with the Community Resource and Referral Center (CRRC), an organization that helps get homeless veterans off the streets and into affordable housing. Our Lodge helps these veterans set up housekeeping by providing beds, bedding, hygiene items and small appliances.

There are very few activities that Nancy doesn't support or participate in. She leads our lodge cleanup days, works the Hoop Shoot events and the Iowa State Fair Spot Shoot. She even organizes our dictionary program. She does not, however, assist with the Lodge deer hide program but there is always next year.

Nancy Newcomb embraces the tenets of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks-Charity, Justice, Brotherly Love and Fidelity without fail and she is truly worthy of being recognized as Elk of the Year. West Des Moines Lodge #2752 is proud to call her our own.




