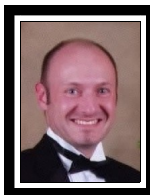

From the Desk of the Chaplain and News Writer

Hello my fellow members. I hope you all are well. Memorial Day is the unofficial start of summer. An American holiday observed on the last Monday in May, to honor the brave men and women who passed while serving in the U.S. military. It was originally called Decoration Day. This began in the early 1860's, during the American Civil War. Citizens would place flowers on the graves of the fallen soldiers killed in battle. It is unclear as to how it really got started. One of the earliest observances took place in Charleston, South Carolina, less than a month after the Confederacy surrendered in 1865. This was organized by a group of formerly enslaved people. On May 5, 1868, General John A. Logan, leader of the Northern Civil War Veterans, wanted to hold a nationwide day of remembrance. He proclaimed "The 30th of May, 1868, is designated for the purpose of strewing with flowers, or otherwise decorating the graves of comrades who died in defense of their country during the late rebellion, and whose bodies now lie in almost every city, village and hamlet churchyard in the land." He chose this date because it wasn't the anniversary of any particular battle. This first Decoration Day, General James Garfield made a speech at the Arlington National Cemetery, where 5,000 participants decorated the graves of 20,000 Civil War soldiers buried there. Several of the Northern states also held Decoration Day events and they quickly made it a yearly tradition. By 1890 the Northern States made it an official state holiday. The southern states held their own remembrances on different dates. This did not change until after World War I. After this war the holiday evolved to include all military personnel who passed in all wars. This later included World War II, The Vietnam War, The Korean War, The Iraq and Afghanistan Wars. Decoration day was always held on May 30, until congress passed the Uniform Monday Holiday Act, in 1968. This was to allow federal employees to have a three day weekend. So the last Monday of the month of May was established as Memorial Day. It went into effect in 1971, also making it a federal holiday. The American flag is also to be at half staff until noon on Memorial Day, then raised to full staff. In 2000, U.S. congress passed legislation, that all Americans are to pause at 3:00 p.m. their local time, drop whatever they are doing and observe a National Moment of Remembrance.

I want to thank each and every one of you, for an amazing year. We couldn't have done this without all of your support. The goal for the year was set by GER Bruce Hidley. Kansas goal was \$4.80 per member. As of 03-31-2023, all eighteen lodges, met their per member goal. The State of Kansas as a whole has donated \$48,035.02 our goal was set at \$22,012.80. That is \$10.47 per member of the 4,586 members in the state. For the 22-23 year Kansas was ranked 21 out of the 48 states.
