## From the Desk of the Chaplain and News Writer



Hello my fellow members. I hope you all are well. June has a lot of things that go on in this month, I want to talk about one significant one that often gets overlooked. By now you have probably heard about Juneteenth. President Abraham Lincoln

issued The Emancipation Proclamation on September 22, 1862, "all persons held as slaves within any State, the people whereof shall then be in rebellion against the United States, shall be then, thence forward, and forever free." It was made effective on January 1, 1863, making enslaved people in Confederate states legally free. However, for many people in these Confederate States were still enslaved. Also, The Emancipation Proclamation only applied to the areas in the Confederacy. In Maryland, that was a Union State, where there were people who were enslavers refused to succeed in the Civil War. President Lincoln knew there had to be a constitutional amendment in order to guarantee the abolishment of slavery. The 13th Amendment passed at the end of the Civil War before the Southern states were restored to the Union. It passed in the Senate in 1864 but lost in the House. President Lincoln insisted that the passage of the 13th Amendment be added to the Republican Party platform for the upcoming 1864 Presidential election. He was successful and the house passed the bill in January of 1865, with a vote of 119-56.

There were not enough troops to enforce the Emancipation Proclamation. For these people it took another two years. Finally, on June 18, 1865, 2,000 Union troops arrived in Galveston Bay, Texas. On June 19, General Gordon Granger announced that more than 250,000 enslaved black people in the state of Texas were free by order of the President of the United States. The former slaves in Texas named June 19th, as Juneteenth and held the first Juneteenth celebration. This is actually our countries second Independence Day. This is the oldest holiday that commemorates the end of slavery in the United States. Then in December 06, 1865 The Thirteenth Amendment was ratified, making all enslaved people free in the entire United States. Three fourths of the necessary states ratified it. The 13th Amendment to the United States Constitution provides that "Neither slavery nor involuntary servitude, except as punishment for crime whereof the party shall have been duly convicted, shall exist within the United States, or any place subject to their jurisdiction." The 13th Amendment along with the 14th and 15th Amendments are the trio of Civil War amendments that expanded the civil rights of all Americans.

After the first Juneteenth celebration, the holiday started to spread across Texas and surrounding states. By the early 1900's is was no longer as popular as it once was. It gained in popularity again in the 1950's and 1960's. In 1980 it became an official state holiday in Texas. At the current time it is currently in a movement to be recognized and to make this a Federal Holiday. Right now 47 states and Washington D.C. recognize Juneteenth. This holiday is generally celebrated with educational activities for children, parades, concerts, beauty pageants, and readings of the Emancipation Proclamation. It is traditional to eat and drink red food to symbolize the blood that has been spilt. Two staples are strawberry soda pop and red velvet cake. This June 19th and every June 19th, remember what these brave people went through to guarantee our freedoms. Please be kind to one another, treat each other with respect and decency.


