From the Desk of the Chaplain

Hello my fellow members. I hope you all are well. Fireworks have been used throughout history to celebrate special events, people or celebrations. Settlers brought fireworks with them to the New World. John Adams (who later became our Second President) wrote on July 2, 1776,

"I am apt to believe that [American independence] will be celebrated, by succeeding generations, as the great anniversary festival. It ought to be commemorated, as the Day of Deliverance by solemn Acts of Devotion to God Almighty. It ought to be solemnized with Pomp and Parade, with Shews, Games, Sports, Guns, Bells, Bonfires and Illuminations from one End of this Continent to the other from this Time forward forever more." The first firework show took place on July 4, 1777. This was the first Independence Day celebration. A ship's cannon fired a 13 -gun salute in honor of the 13 colonies. The Pennsylvania Evening Post reported: "at night there was a grand exhibition of fireworks (which began and concluded with thirteen rockets) on the Commons, and the city was beautifully illuminated." That same night the Sons of Liberty set off fireworks over Boston Common. Fireworks were originally orange. They were that way until 1830 when new modern fireworks were developed. Italian pyrotechnicians first added color to fireworks with chlorinated powder and metallic salts. They used strontium to get red, barium to get green, sodium to get yellow and copper to get blue which is the rarest of all firework colors. This is because it's easily destroyed in high temperatures. No person to date has figured out what combination of chemicals will get the perfect color of blue. Blue is usually dimmer and blends in with the night sky. Potassium chlorate as an oxidizer makes the hues of the other colors brighter. I hope you all had a wonderful and safe Independence Day.

KEA STATE FLAG DAY

Saturday, June 10 the KEA Flag Day Celebration was held in Wichita KS at 1:30 p.m. The ceremony was held at Veterans Memorial Park Flag Pavilion. It honored the current American flag and the versions used previously. The president of the Kansas Elks Association Roger Slief, talked about why we

should celebrate Flag Day. "I think we should do it every year so people do not forget what it represents," Rodger Slief said. "And how we are living in freedom.". This year marks the 116th Anniversary of the Grand Lodge's 1907 designation of June 14 as Flag Day. The Grand Lodge of the Order adopted mandatory observance of the occasion by every Lodge in 1911 and that requirement continues to this day. The Elks promoted President Woodrow Wilson to recognize the Order's observance of Flag Day for its patriotic expression. However, it was not until 1949 when President Harry Truman, himself an Elks member, made the proclamation that thereafter June 14 would be a day of national observance of the symbol of our great nation.
