
Update on the Bylaws.

The October Newsletter will have the changes that are needed for our Lodge By-laws, Rules of Order and House Rules that must be reviewed every five (5) years.

Statutes 17.060 states the By-laws, Rules of Order and House Rules of a Lodge shall be proposed in writing, read at a regular meeting, and laid over for vote at a regular Lodge meeting to be held not less than two (2) weeks nor more than ten (10) weeks thereafter. The Bylaw committee will present the changes at the Sept 11th Lodge Meeting under New Business, Changes will be printed in the October newsletter and voting on said changes will be at the October 23rd Lodge Meeting under Old Business. Once voted on the Lodge Bylaws, Rules of Order and House Rules will be sent to Grand Lodge for final approval.

Over \$5000.00 Donated by West Des Moines Elks to Help Veterans!

Every night, as many as 40,000 veterans are living on the streets. Each with a different story, they all shared a common pledge: to support and defend this country. Their service is done. Now, it's the Elks' turn to serve.

In partnership with the Department of Veterans Affairs, the Elks National Veterans Service Commission has pledged to help end veteran homelessness, and ensure that every veteran has the safe, stable home they deserve. One of the VA Programs is Community Resource and Referral Centers (CRRCs) and one of the Elks National Veterans Service Commission's programs to help is called **"Welcome Home"**. The West Des Moines Elks Lodge has embraced the "Welcome Home" project and has partnered with the CCRC in Des Moines to identify Veterans who need help.

Most veterans move into their homes with nothing. Elks help veterans establish their homes by building "Welcome Home Kits". Generally, this kit would include some small furniture, kitchenware, and cleaning supplies. Items can be new or used, donated or purchased. The Lodge identifies the Veteran in need and what they need through the CCRC. So far this year the WDM Lodge has provided \$5229.00 worth of items needed by Veterans moving out of homelessness.

Nina Steele is heading up the Welcome Home program at our Lodge and has spent over 300 hours shopping and delivering items for the Veterans. She recently was able to take a Bicycle to a Veteran that had no available transportation. Pictured with the Bicycle is the Manager of the Des Moines CCRC, Carrie Moreno.

LARRY CRAMER NAVY 1959-1963





Larry Cramer, PER has been a member of the West Des Moines Lodge #2752 for over 30 years. He went through all the chairs of the lodge and served as Exalted ruler in 2000-2001 then 5 years as a Trustee. He also served as the Elks State Government Relations officer for over 20 years and just retired from that position this year and was also SW District Hoop Shoot Chairman for over 5 years. He was elected Elk of the year for the SW District in both 2007 and 2017.

Over the years Larry has volunteered to be in charge of many programs and events in the Lodge such as the monthly Sunday Breakfast, the Lodge Hoop Shoot Program, the annual Spot Shoot at the State Fair, and the Veterans Leather Program, just to name a few.

Larry is also a Veteran, he enlisted in the Navy when he was 19 years old during the Cold War with Russia and during the Cambodian conflict. His rank was Second Class Petty Officer (E-5). He was part of the Heavy Attack Squadron Eight (VAH-8). Larry was assigned to Aviation Ordnance (A02), his job was to load and arm the Hydrogen Bomb! The Aircraft was an A3D bomber (The largest bomber that could land on an aircraft carrier at the time).


Larry was stationed at Oak Harbor, Washington and assigned to the USS Midway CVA-41 when at sea. He served in the Pacific (Westpac-Far East) including Cambodia and Vietnam and also served during the Cuban Missile Crisis.

During his service he had the opportunity to visit Hawaii, Japan, Hong Kong, China, the Philippine Islands and float around Cuba! Thank you, Larry, for your service to our country and all you do to support the Lodge in its efforts to be "Patriotic" and support our wonderful country.
