Veterans day is November 11th. This day was selected as it was on November 11, 1918, that WW1 ended. A year later President Woodrow Wilson proclaimed Nov 11th as Armistice Day. In 1938 it became a federal holiday. In 1954 at the urging of veterans the name was changed to Veterans Day.

Following World War I, there was a strong desire throughout the Elks organization to erect a fitting memorial to those brothers who had laid down their lives in the name of loyal patriotism and devotion to country which they had assumed at their fraternal altars. At the Grand Lodge session convened in Chicago in 1920, a special committee was created and assigned with the task of planning the design and construction of this new memorial.



Tonya is a NEW member of our West Des Moines Elks Lodge. She just joined in September2023! **Thank you, Tonya, for your service to our country!**Tonya served in the Iowa National Guard from 1988 to 2017. She took her basic training in Ft Jackson South Carolina. Her first assignment was in Clinton, Iowa in Radio Repair. Shortly, she was moved to Des Moines and worked full time at Camp Dodge in the Department of Logistics.

Logistics, in the military sense, is all the activities of armed force units in roles supporting combat units, including transport, supply, signal communication, medical aid, and the like. Tonya got in on the ground level of bringing Logistics into the Age of Computerization. She worked at Camp Dodge in Automated Logistics and Repair until she retired in 2017.
