Lodge Meetings are held twice a month, on the **second and fourth Tuesday, 7:30 pm** in the Lodge Hall. All members are welcome. The Bar is closed during Lodge meetings and re-opens when the meeting has officially ended.

From the October 10, 2023, Approved Minutes (compiled): for a complete report, please ask the Secretary for the filed copy. Thank you.

MEMBER STATISTICS: Delinquency Member Count continues to fall, now 84 (in mid-October).

WELCOMED GUESTS: District Deputy Colleen Ford attended the Lodge regular meeting, reminding attending members of the Grand Lodge Motto: **WE ARE... THE ELKS!** (shout it out!) and encouraging members to show our communities what Elks stand for, to keep up the great work and tackle this lodge's delinquency rate. If you know someone on the list, help your committee by reaching out to the person. The Newark Lodge has donated \$10.48 per member to the Elks National Foundation for a grand total of \$4,645.38, receiving the Beacon, Gratitude, Freedom and the Spotlight Grants as well as the Impact Grant. Deputy District Colleen Ford concluded by thanking everyone.

Cape Henlopen Transfer **James Detzi** attended the Lodge meeting ahead of his formal transfer to Newark Elks Lodge #2281. Welcome home James!

PER ASSOCIATION: Meetings will resume after a summer break.

CAMP BARRETT: The Ocean City Camporee will be held November 17-19 at Camp Barrett (Beth Biddison reporting). Both Biddisons plan on attending. PER JR Biddison reported that Camp Barrett needs help for the Camporee.

ELKS NATIONAL FOUNDATION: Fidelity membership seems stuck at 12 for over two years now. Our lodge is growing, and we need more Fidelity Club members for eligibility for our Grant-to-Grant bonuses. This is percentage-rated, with calculations at Grand Lodge, depending on the members we have and if we meet the percentages, to receive bonuses.

October is ENF month, and our fundraiser is the coin board. The ENF TV features the program and can be viewed in the lounge.

OTHER COMMITTEES: Member Beth Biddison announced the **Craft Fair** is **November 4, 9-3** almost all 30 tables are reserved. People will be expected to set up on Friday night and need a few people to help.

READING OF COMMUNICATIONS: Secretary Maria Beaton read the Deputy District Colleen Ford's reminder of the Delaware Alcohol Control Commissioner Bill for packaged goods limits.

OTHER BUSINESS: Thanks were extended to the **Boy Scouts** for conducting the Flag Retirement Ceremony. There were so many flags to be retired that preparations are underway for Flag Day next year.

The Boy Scouts relocated to a church but wished to retain the number #2281. They are renovating their new place and need help with donations.

State Association President's motto is **To Soar to Greater Heights**. This year, the State Association has added 1,149 members.

Crab Feast report: \$8,669 in income, \$4,755.39 in expenses with a net profit of \$3,913.61. PER Biddison thanked all members who helped with their time and effort.

We are finally in the BOOK! Meaning the Elks Magazine of course, for honoring Veterans at the VA Hospital and the great job done by **Ed Clarke**.

PER Biddison gave a final and solemn announcement on the passing June 3, 2023, of **PER Robert McIntyre**, who served as District Deputy for the Northeast District of Maryland Delaware and District of Columbia 2017-2018.

Heads up Grand Lodge Dues Increasing Next Year

Grand Lodge dues will increase from \$17.00 to \$22.00 per member. This increase is a result of high cost losses across the country, hurricane damage, fires, alcohol related liability. Just a reminder the Newark Lodge #2281 dues will remain unchanged at \$58.75 (does not include State or Grand Lodge assessment) as disclosed in our By-Laws which was approved by the membership. The breakdown of the Grand Lodge dues is as follows:

Grand Lodge expenses and operations	\$	6.50
Subscription to Elks Magazine	\$	5.50
General Liability Insurance Assessment	\$	22.00
Total Grand Lodge Dues	\$	34.00

On the Lodge front we have continued to reduce cost over the past few years which allows us to maintain the low cost Lodge dues (as compared to other lodges across the country). Installation of the new HVAC system for the Hall has yielded a 17% decrease in electricity cost (July, Jun, Aug compare to same time last year), in April we will have a clearer picture of yearly savings. Electricity costs have also improved due installation of LED bulbs throughout the entire Lodge and signing a 3 yr contract with an electricity supplier fixing our per KWh price in an environment of increasing energy cost. These are the kinds of investments in our Lodge that keep our Lodge dues in check. We all know prices are increasing everywhere and yes we have to increase food and beverage prices selectively. Another way to look at our bargain dues, at a total cost of \$95, this represents less than \$8.00/month.
