Veterans Day Dinner

Boise Elks Lodge celebrated Veterans Day on Friday November 10th. Prior to the free dinner for Veterans, Lodge Members presented the Colors of the American Military Forces. The US Army flag was presented by flag bearer John VerKerk, a Veteran of the US Army. The US Marine Corps flag was presented by flag bearer Jackie McFalls, whose husband Randy McFalls was a Veteran of the US Marine Corps. The US Navy flag was presented by flag bearer Dennis Hyland, a Veteran of Her Majesty's Navy before coming to the colonies, and now an American Elk. The US Air Force flag was presented by flag bearer Jeffery Colaric, a Veteran of the US Air Force. The US Space Force flag was presented by flag bearer Ross Chadd, one of our Trustees, because there aren't any Veterans of the US Space Force yet. The US Coast Guard flag was presented by flag bearer John Conners, a Veteran of the US Air Force (Our Coast Guard Veteran is John Dahl who is currently in North Carolina). The last Flag to be presented was the Flag of POW / MIA, and he flag bearer was Gary Hoesing, a Veteran of the US Army.

We have about 350 Members, and our Veterans are listed as: Army - 69 of which 4 could have served in WWII, Marines - 6 of which 1 was in the French Marines, Navy - 25 of which 3 could have served in WWII, Air Force – 36, Coast Guard – 1, and Space Force zero. And we have a few Members who served in more than 1 branch of service.

The Lodge doesn't have an accurate count of the military service years, however, these 136 members have an accumulated total of 3,327 years as Elks, serving the Lodge and our communities.

The fabulous meal of roast beef, potatoes, gravy, veggies, roll and some great desserts was prepared and served by Michael and Diane Knickerbocker and his crew of , Robin S, Julie W, Bugs S, Sue A, Bob A, and Ross C.
