We gave Veterans \$1,000 in Fred Meyer gift cards to help with gas and clothing. \$6,000 was spent helping low income and homeless children obtain needed school supplies and \$2,000 was used to purchase food for the Open Door Community Kitchen. We helped them prepare and deliver 1,350 meals to homeless families through Family Promise and an additional 2,090 meals to the elderly in our community this past year.

Donations to ENF are tax deductible and help keep this awesome program going. Member donations also help our lodge qualify for more grants. Consider a donation today. 
