





Per-Member Giving: \$12.20

Congratulations! Our Lodge has met the GER's current per-member giving goal for this year (\$4.80/member), which means we're eligible to apply for a Gratitude Grant next year. Our Lodge can also earn up to four \$500 Gratitude Grant bonuses by meeting the following criteria.

Membership Support (Goal: 15%)

178 members of our Lodge have donated this year, which is 40.2% of our membership. Since our donor support exceeds 15% of our 443 members, we have met this criteria.

Fidelity Club (Goal: 9 members)

Our Lodge currently has 12 Fidelity Club members. Since our Fidelity Club goal is 9 members, we have met this criteria.

Chair Challenge Score (Goal: 550)

Our Chairman Challenge Composite Score is currently 706.000. Since that score exceeds the Composite Score goal of 550, we have met this criteria.

Fundraising Increase (Goal: 10%)

Our Lodge fundraising total this year is \$5,404.14. To meet the Fundraising criteria, we need to raise \$13,685.93, which is 10 percent more than the \$12,441.75 we raised last year.

Currently our ENF donations are \$879.64 below the the same period last year. Our fundraiser Coin Board raised \$1,000 and I'm awaiting the report of any ENF donations received after 9/15/23 so that they can be submitted along with the \$1000. This should more than bring us up to last year's totals. We need to meet the end of fiscal year 10% increase in donations (\$13,685.93) to qualify for the \$500 Gratitude Grant Bonus. Please get your donations in so that we can meet this last of the qualifications.

LIFE MEMBERSHIPS:

From time to time a member asks about getting a Life Membership. The Newark Elks Lodge #2281 By-laws and Grand Lodge Statutes specify that to be eligible for a Life Membership, a member must:

Have paid to a lodge or lodges the required annual dues for a period of 30 years, AND

Have attained the age of not less than 65 years.

Explanation: While Grand Lodge recently did away with the age requirement, it also allows individual lodges to require a minimum age. The Newark Elks Lodge #2281 has a minimum age requirement of 65 years in its By-laws as well as 30 years minimum paying dues requirement.

Members interested in becoming a Life Member should check with the Secretary to see if they are eligible. Eligible Members wishing to request a Life Membership must be nominated for such in writing. Anyone with questions regarding Life Memberships should contact Maria Beaton, the Secretary.



Heads up Grand Lodge Dues Increasing Next Year

Grand Lodge dues will increase from \$17.00 to \$22.00 per member. This increase is a result of high cost losses across the country, hurricane damage, fires, alcohol related liability. Just a reminder the Newark Lodge #2281 dues will remain unchanged at \$58.75 (does not include State or Grand Lodge assessment) as disclosed in our By-Laws which was approved by the membership. The breakdown of the Grand Lodge dues is as follows:

Grand Lodge expenses and operations	\$ 6.50
Subscription to Elks Magazine	\$ 5.50
General Liability Insurance Assessment	\$ 22.00
Total Grand Lodge Dues	\$ 34.00

On the Lodge front we have continued to reduce cost over the past few years which allows us to maintain the low cost Lodge dues (as compared to other lodges across the country). Installation of the new HVAC system for the Hall has yielded a 17% decrease in electricity cost (July, Jun, Aug compare to same time last year), in April we will have a clearer picture of yearly savings. Electricity costs have also improved due installation of LED bulbs throughout the entire Lodge and signing a 3 yr contract with an electricity supplier fixing our per KWh price in an environment of increasing energy cost. These are the kinds of investments in our Lodge that keep our Lodge dues in check. We all know prices are increasing everywhere and yes we have to increase food and beverage prices selectively. Another way to look at our bargain dues, at a total cost of \$95, this represents less than \$8.00/month.
