From the Desk of the Chaplain & News Writer



Hello my fellow members. It is February once again. This month we had Candlemas Day and Groundhog Day on February 02. Mardi Gras is February 13. I wrote about this last year. Unlike most holidays that have set dates, Mardi Gras and Ash Wednesday changes each year. The dates of these are determined as to when Easter falls each year. Easter is always the first Sunday after the full moon following the spring Equinox.

Easter can fall anywhere between March 23 and April 25. This is why it moves around. Mardi Gras is exactly 47 days before Easter and one day before Ash Wednesday. Mardi Gras can fall between February 3 to March 9. Even though Mardi Gras is several days of celebration, the main day is always Fat Tuesday the day before Ash Wednesday. Now how many of you actually realized that these holidays are all tied together? This time I am going to touch more on Ash Wednesday. This year Ash Wednesday is also the same day as Valentine's Day. Ash Wednesday is the start of the Lenton season. Ash Wednesday is always six and half weeks before Easter, beginning the Lenton season of preparation for Christ's Resurrection on Easter Sunday. Ash Wednesday dates back to the 11th century. In ancient Hebrew customs, wearing sackcloth and dusting oneself with ashes is a sign of penance. The Bible does not explicitly detail this first day of Lent, but there are many instances referenced in the Old Testament. One such instance is "I have sewed sackcloth upon my skin, and have laid my strength in the dust. (Job 16:15)" Ashes signify the mortality of our human bodies. " By the sweat of your face you shall eat bread until you return to the ground, for out of it you were taken; you are dust, and to dust you shall return. (Genesis 3:19)" This was the norm in the early Christian Church; to wear sackcloth and ashes in public penance for people who had sinned. As the Church grew this became less common. This old tradition of publicly recognizing ourselves as sinners and seeking our renewal with God had evolved into what we know now as Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent. Ash Wednesday awakens us to Jesus' entry into the desert before his death. A period of 40 days (excluding Sundays), to remember Jesus' trials in the desert, where he resisted temptations of the devil, starting on Ash Wednesday. At the end of this, Jesus was tried, sentenced to death, and executed, and on that Easter Sunday, he rose again. This day also allows us to prepare our hearts for his Resurrection. We do this by recognizing our brokenness and need for conversion and turn our hearts to God. In the Catholic Church there are two days of fasting and abstinence. These are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting is a sign of repentance and helps us embody the spiritual hunger for Christ our Lord, who himself fasted in the desert for forty days before his death and Resurrection. Ash Wednesday is also a day to begin a renewed commitment to prayer. A simple prayer will do "God, may Your light guide my day, and your spirit bring me peace. Amen." It really is that simple to be in touch with the God Almighty. He is always with all of us, you just have to believe. It doesn't have to be lengthy to have substance. Just like in the Bible, not all verses are long. "And everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved. (Acts 2:21)" This Ash Wednesday I encourage all of you to reflect and to remember what the holiday is for. It is the same day as Valentine's this year, which makes it even more special, so love one another and remember to thank the Lord for his sacrifice. I pray that each and every one of you have a wonderful holiday, this entire Easter season, and remember to be kind to one another. Amen. My email SeanCutsinger@gmail.com.
