



Florida Elks Children's Therapy Services provides inhome physical and occupational therapy to Florida children in need



of such services. This rehabilitation is necessary to be rendered in the home because of the absence of these services locally or because of the patient being medically infirmed at home. Priority is given to children who do not have ready access to therapy as a result of financial considerations.

Our services focus on child-centered treatment and family education throughout Florida. Our program is based on the premise that skilled therapy services combined with the completion of an individualized home program, exercises and activities designed by the therapist will positively impact children and families. FECTS believes children and their families or caregivers need to be viewed in a holistic manner. Upon receiving the patient application of referral, the therapist will arrange a home visit for evaluation purposes. If the patient is accepted into the program, a regular weekly home visitation schedule is established.

Eligibility for treatment will be based on several factors including medical needs and other criteria, such as but not limited to:

- 1. The child must be a resident of Florida
- 2. The child must be between the ages of birth and 18 years of age
- 3. The child must have a medical condition necessitating Physical or Occupational Therapies
- 4. The patient must have rehabilitative potential
- 5. The patient must have financial need for free services




