# MESSAGE FROM THE EXALTED RULER



It has been a long while since we have had a proper newsletter. We are trying to get the Lodge back into our groove and normal routine prior to Covid. It has been a new and challenging experience for me, but I think we are getting back to where we need to be.

I am coming up to the end of my 8th year in a row as Exalted Ruler. The lodge has done rather well and I have had the pleasure of working alongside of many new Elks and many long-time Elks. As any ER will tell you, having a full slate of officers and a lodge full of active and

engaged Elks is the biggest challenge. My first year as ER, we were at 163 members and falling fast. In 2019, we hit a high of 249 members and currently are at 241 members. Let's continue to grow our membership with other quality Elks. I am proud of what we have accomplished and if I had one wish, it would be that some of our long-time members were a bit more active. I miss seeing those familiar faces. Let's try to get out and be a bit more social with each other in the coming lodge year!

Our lodge has been a great source of support the local community and those in need of assistance. Our lodge, though small, has consistently and directly donated nearly \$12,000 each back into our community. That's impressive for such a small lodge. It is a testament to the hard work and generosity of our members.

Our chair officers have stepped up this year practicing the Ritual when time permitted and I hope they continue to do so into the future. All of the Officers have done a great job running the lodge Elk business and commitments. Elk business is not always noticed by everyone but without it being properly taken care of, we would not have a place to call our own.

Our member volunteers have gone above and beyond to keep the lodge open and running. We have a very limited number of members running the social quarters and events at the lodge. It's not always convenient but they have done the work and the lodge as best they can. Be sure to thank them when you see them. Sometimes, it feels like a thankless job.

This past autumn, the lodge updated our by-laws as required by the Grand Lodge statutes. The by-law updates have been sent to the Grand Lodge Judiciary for approval. As many of you know, the cost just to operate the lodge with the Grand lodge, State association and insurance costs have skyrocketed over the past few years. Unfortunately, these costs have to be passed onto the members. Once approved, the annual lodge dues will be \$35.00 per year plus all GL, State and insurance fees. This varies each year and you will have a

breakdown of the costs when you receive your yearly dues statements this month.


It has been a pleasure to serve you all of the past eight years!

# MESSAGE FROM THE TRUSTEES

The Trustees are planning to work on updating entry codes for all members to use in accessing the lodge via the keypad at the side door. Brad and Linda Sanford are working with Whitetail for training so that we can maintain and update codes as needed on an ongoing basis. Once installed, each member will have a unique code to use in accessing the lodge during normal hours. Officers, Trustees, and house committee members will have codes to allow wider access. Fobs will be supplied to positions that require access to areas of the lodge with restricted access, such as the walk in cooler for bartenders.

We also continue to work with other entities such as the Hunterdon County Health Department, the State of New Jersey, and the city to ensure the lodge is properly licensed and running within all required parameters for all operations.

With the end of the lodge year in sight, the Trustees will be developing the lodge budget for the new year.

Trustee meetings are held monthly on the first Tuesday of the month at 6:30 pm. Members are welcome to attend if they wish to observe and comment.

The cornerstone of Elks' service to veterans, this program illustrates the Elks motto,


