

Hello my fellow members. It is March once again. This month we have St. Patrick's Day and Easter. Just like Mardi Gras and Ash Wednesday, Easter also moves around. The dates of all of these are determined as to when Easter falls each year. Easter is always the first Sunday after the full moon following the spring Equinox. Easter can fall anywhere between March 22 and April 25. Choosing the date for Easter has been a continued

argument for centuries. Since the followers of Christ neglected to record the exact date of Jesus' resurrection, it has been a hot topic. The earliest believers in the church of Asia Minor (most of current day Turkey), wanted Easter to correlate to the Jewish Passover. The Jewish holiday calendar is based on solar and lunar cycles, this is why Easter moves around. During the Council of Nicaea in 325 A.D., the Western Church wanted a standardized system to determine the date of Easter. In today's Christian society, Easter is celebrated on the Sunday following the Paschal Full Moon (the Vernal Equinox). The word Paschal means "Passover" in Greek. According to the Gospel of John, "Jesus was crucified the day before Passover, at the time the paschal lamb was slain (John 19:14). The apostle Paul saw Jesus as the completion and fulfillment of the paschal sacrifice (I Corinthians 5:7). Christ is the spotless Lamb of God, sacrificed for the sins of the people, whose blood protects from God's wrath and opens the way for God's full redemption (Romans 3:25; 5:9; Ephesians 1:7; Revelation 1:5)." In the early days of the Christian church, all believers agreed to celebrate Christ's death and his resurrection to the time and season of when it was believed to have happened. This would be the time of the Jewish Passover. They also agreed that the Lord's crucifixion had taken place on a Friday, which coincided with the 14th day of Nisan, the day on which the Thus, the original celebrations of Easter by the paschal lamb was slain. Christian church were celebrated on the Sunday immediately following the first astronomical full moon after the Vernal equinox. Astronomers were then able to approximate the dates of all the full moons in the future. By doing this they established a table of Ecclesiastical Full Moon dates. By 1583 A.D. the table determining the Ecclesiastical Full Moon dates was permanently set and it has been used every year since. Now here are some really interesting facts about the Easter dates. We know that the earliest date is March 22, however this is the rarest date. Nobody alive will ever see this date of Easter. The last one was in 1818 and the next one will be in 2285. The next rarest date is the last date, April 25. The last time Easter fell on this date was in 1943 and the next one will be in 2038. So, God willing I will get to see this one happen. If you look at the dates between 1925 through 2100 the following dates show up 7 times; they are March 30, 31, April 5, 6, 10, 11, 12, 15,17, and 21. Since my birthday is April 17, I have had Easter fall once so far in my lifetime, that was in 2022. Before that it fell in 1960 and I wasn't born until 1969. I pray I get to see the next two which will be 2033 and 2044. I thought it is cool that they are falling 22, 33, 44. I pray that each and every one of you have a wonderful holiday, this entire Easter season, and remember to be kind to one another. Amen. My email SeanCutsinger@gmail.com.
