





2009 Elks HOOP-SHOOT

The annual county Hoop-Shoot competition sponsored by the North Wilkesboro Elks Lodge was held at East Middle School Saturday morning January 10. Nelson Martin, Hoop-Shoot chairman, opened the event followed by the invocation given by the Lodge Chaplain, Greg Fuller. The pledge of allegiance was led by Kenneth Foster, Exalted Ruler of the Lodge. A large crowd of spectators were in attendance. The Elks Hoop-Shoot contest is the largest competitive national tournament for youngsters of its type. Two of our local Hoop-Shooters, Erin Dancy (2008) and Erin Cothren (2005) made it all the way to the national finals in Springfield, MA during previous competitions.

The Elks Hoop-Shoot allows youngsters in three age brackets, (8-9), (10-11) and (12-13), to compete in a best of 25 free throws shooting contest. County wide participants numbered 3,971. Girls and Boys compete within their respective age groups. Winners from each participating school are invited to the county contest where they compete for first, second and third place honors.

First place winners from each age category earn the opportunity to advance to the West District Elks Hoop-Shoot competition to be held Saturday, January 31 at Lenoir-Rhyne University in Hickory, NC.

Each participant and volunteer received an Elks Hoop-Shoot T-shirt. First, second and third place county winners and their families will be invited to the Lodge for the annual Hoop-Shoot awards presentations. The North Wilkesboro Elks Lodge congratulates all of the participants and winners and is grateful to East Wilkes Middle School for hosting the 2008 Hoop-Shoot event. Special thanks are extended to Hoop-Shoot Chairman, Nelson Martin, Sharon Guenther, school coaches, teachers and administrators, Lodge members and to everyone else who volunteered their time and effort.

Valentine's Day – A History

There are varying opinions as to the origin of Valentine's Day. Some experts state that it originated from St. Valentine, a Roman who was martyred for refusing to give up Christianity. He died on February 14, 269 A.D., the same day that had been devoted to love lotteries. Legend also says that St. Valentine left a farewell note for the jailer's daughter, who had become his friend, and signed it "From Your Valentine." Other aspects of the story say that Saint Valentine served as a priest at the temple during the reign of Emperor Claudius. Claudius then had Valentine jailed for defying him. In 496 A.D. Pope Gelasius set aside February 14 to honor St. Valentine. Gradually, February 14 became the date for exchanging love messages and St. Valentine became the patron saint of lovers. The date was marked by sending poems and simple gifts such as flowers. There was often a social gathering or a ball.
