

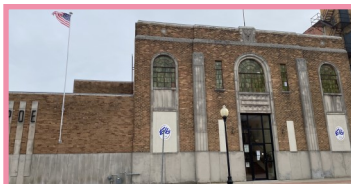

From the Desk of the Chaplain & News Writer

Hello my fellow members. May has arrived and the flowers are blooming. On May first there have been different observances and celebrations. The meaning of seasonal change is the most common amongst different countries. May Day is one of the four ancient Celtic cross-quarter days. This makes it an astronomical holiday as it falls between the March Equinox and the June solstice. It originated from the Celtic name "Belthane". Belthane was a spring celebration that had singing, dancing, and bonfires. Houses and animals would be decorated with yellow May flowers and ribbons. In Ireland town folks would visit wells. These town folk believed the dew would bring beauty and youthfulness. During the Middle Ages in England, the villagers would place maypoles in their yards. They would go into the woods and try to find the tallest tree to form a pole. The villages would have competitions to see who would have the tallest one. The pole symbolizes male fertility and baskets and wreaths symbolizes female fertility. The villagers would dance around the pole carrying baskets with flowers.

In the 19th century, a new meaning of May Day came about. This day became the day of International Workers' Day. Representing labor rights and an eight hour work day in the United States. Before that 12 hours was the typical working day before labor protests. International Workers' Day is a day to honor those who lost their lives at the Haymarket Affair that took place in Chicago on May 1, 1886. We don't really recognize this day any longer as we now have Labor Day that takes it's place.

Through the years different cultures had their own beliefs and traditions during this time. Europe and America celebrate May Day very similar, with flower crowns, maypole dancing and baskets of flowers to share with their loved ones. May day represents the return of spring and through the years children started making baskets, placing sweets and flowers in them, then place them on their neighbors door steps and run away yelling "May Basket". In Hawaii it is known as "Lei Day", a celebration of the aloha spirit and the giving of a flower. What a fantastic way to show someone you love them.

May Day is an official holiday in 66 different countries and an unofficial holiday in many more. I have always enjoyed this time of year as the flowers start blooming. This year take some time out of your very busy day and go outside and enjoy what Mother Nature has to offer. Be a kid and make a May Day basket and give it to your neighbors. You might just put a smile on someone's face. Especially, since there is so much negativity in the world right now. I pray that each of you have a wonderful spring and don't forget that sometimes, you just need to stop and smell the flowers. Amen.
