

ELKS BBQ FUNDRAISER

The Elks #322 BBQ was constructed in the 1960's with standard brick and mortar. Over the many years of use by CYOS, Orientations, Vet's Dinners, banquets and fundraisers just to name a few; the BBQ has sustained major structural damage that is no longer repairable. We are proposing to rebuild the BBQ making an attempt to salvage the original iron and replace the pit with new fire brick and cinderblock walls. To fund this major overhaul, we are forming a BBQ committee and plan to sell personalized bricks to commemorate our 125 anniversary of the Lodge. The exact design has yet to be determined but will offer bricks in several sizes and donation amounts so that members may permanently memorialize their commitment to our Lodge.

What does Per Capita mean? The amount of funds Grand Lodge asks each Lodge to raise per member to help support The Elks National Foundation (ENF). Per Capita is \$4.85 per member. This last year we raised \$5.68 per member! We qualify to receive these funds back through The Elks National Foundation via Grants, Scholarships and Community Investment Programs.

A record number of grants were given out last year! In our district alone \$79,000 was granted. Grants are an important part of giving back to our community. We strive to apply and receive every grant available to us by Grand Lodge.

Scholarships and Vocational Grants are an import part of ENF as well. If you know anyone who is a member, child of a member or grandchild of a

Lastly ENF gives every year a portion of the giving to Major Project. Last year we gave 1.2 million dollars.

A COIN A DAY By Shane Bagnall, Lecturing Knight & Lodge Historian





Following initiation into our Lodge, each new Member is presented with the beloved Purple Pig bank. By filling up the Purple Pig with your pocket change and turning it into the Lodge office, the California-Hawaii Elks Association Major Project, Inc. (CHEMPI) is able to provide important services for children with disabilities. This program is often referred to as the "Major Project" and it has raised over 116 million dollars since it began in 1950. When a coin is inserted, the Purple Pig tips his hat and this is what makes it possible for the Major Project to meet the unmet needs of these children.

Having started in 1950, this program is certainly interesting from a historical perspective, but our focus here will be on the endearing little plastic piggy bank that has become the mascot of this great organization. Invented by Wes-Ko Products of Los Angeles, these banks were advertised as "Action Piggy Banks" that made saving fun. Thanks to vintage packaging and advertising, we know that the pig's name is "Snooty" and he came in a variety of sizes and colors.

Thanks to an article in the May/June 2018 issue of the California-Hawaii Elk Magazine, we have a historical timeline on the Elks' use of this bank. Initially, jars with special labels were sent to Lodges in the district for raising funds for Major Project, with the eventual goal of having custom banks provided to each lodge, and eventually each member in the California-Hawaii Elks Association. In 1954, the first order was placed for 110,000 "No. 50 Snooty Jr." banks which were then sent to Lodges for distribution to Members.

We look forward to future "Purple Pig Roundups," but you can always bring your full bank into the Lodge office at any time during office hours. Each Member is given credit for their donation to Major Project, and it counts towards our Lodge's per capita total. Another way to help is by using Amazon Smile for all of your Amazon purchases and selecting the California-Hawaii Elks Association as the recipient. Every little bit helps, and as Snooty says: "A Coin a Day, They'll Walk, Talk, See and Play!"
