While you are home celebrating the 250th Anniversary of the birth of our country, First Lady Debbie and I are off to Chicago to represent the Prescott Elks and attend the Grand Lodge Convention. While you are enjoying your 4th of July, we will be busily attending meetings and learning what some of the other lodges across our country are doing. We are looking forward to the trip and to the fellowship with all of our Elks friends. It will be a wonderful and memorable time for us together.

In June, I talked about all of the good works done by the Elks at a State level. Combined, the Arizona Lodges donated more than \$389k to our Arizona Elks Major Project helping children with terminal diseases through a program of supporting research and services of the Steele Research Center in Tucson.

This month, we turn our attention to the Elks National Foundation. ENF provides our youth with a healthy beginning through scholarships; it honors the Elks' pledge to never forget our veterans; it assists the Elks state association's major projects and funds projects that improve the quality of life by investing in communities where Elks live and work.

Since the first \$100k endowment in 1928, the Elks National Foundation has managed ongoing contributions returning the interest to local lodges and State Major Projects. All ENF donations go into a permanent endowment fund, earning interest for lifetimes. Today there are more than 124,000 active donors and a fund valued at more than \$909 million. So far, ENF has contributed more than \$325 million toward Elks' charitable projects nationwide.

Through ENF, we touch many different groups of people. I believe that we are one of the most flexible organizations for volunteering your time, talent and support. While we will always accept your gracious financial support, you can also help us provide ongoing assistance and friendship to our Veterans and seniors. You can volunteer to help us with our "Hoop Shoot". ENF is also a major sponsor of the D.A.R.E. program.

With so many volunteer options on the table, I want to say "Thank you" to everyone who sponsored a new member or has volunteered some of their time to help make this lodge a better place. I also want to thank everyone who has visited the lodge during these last three months. Your continued support and financial support are critical to our survival as a lodge and as a benevolent organization. It is clear that the Prescott Elks Lodge is blessed with many good and talented members. I want you to know that you are all appreciated and valued as an individual and integral part of our family.

Veteran's Committee



The flag of our country, the emblem of freedom and symbol of unity. Our Star-Spangled Banner has a very long and glorious 250-year history. But there is one flag that, to me, holds a very special place in my heart.

I was about seven years old when I first saw it in person. I still remember looking up to all of it with open eyed amazement and awe. It was big. It was dirty and torn and, well, not exactly like I had imagined it. I wondered why it just didn't look like the ones on flag poles at my school. What happened to this 15-star flag and why was it on display at the Smithsonian?

The actual flag that Francis Scott Key saw when he wrote the poem later called the Star-Spangled Banner was unique. During the War of 1812, Major George Armistead, commanding officer at Ft. McHenry, desired "to have a flag so large that the British will have no difficulty in seeing it from a distance. In the summer of 1813, Armistead ordered a large garrison flag (30' by 42') for the Fort. He famously commissioned the massive garrison flag to be sewn by Mary Pickersgill. Ironically, this flag is made of the finest English Wool.

In September 1814, during the 25-hour "Battle for Baltimore", Armistead's troops held their ground without surrendering. At daybreak, the sight of his enormous flag, as opposed to a British surrender flag, prompted Key (who was watching from a truce ship) to pen his famous poem.

Then, in a complete violation of Army regulations, Commander George Armistead took the flag home as a souvenir. He stole that flag, and with public knowledge, it remained in the possession of his family for 90 years.

It was during this time (the rebirth of our nation after the war with the British, a Civil War and, a war with the Spanish) that word quietly spread about the Armistead family having this flag. As each battle played out, each victory meant there was something more and more special about this symbol.

We still call it the "emblem of freedom". To many others of that day, it symbolized something that could not be easily put into words. Seeing it was something deeply moving. People were extremely reverent as they beheld the size of the banner, the sacrifices given for it, the weight of the love felt beneath it. Occasionally, visitors to the Armistead's home would ask for a piece of it to take home. And so it was that naval historians like George Preble, and others who temporarily held the flag, trimmed and cut the wool from the edges. Snippets were given to dignitaries, household staff, and veterans as tokens of gratitude. Piece by piece, snippet by snippet, they held in their hands a tangible piece of our freedom, of our collective history, and of lives given for it.

When the flag was loaned to the Smithsonian Museum for display in 1907, almost half of the 42-foot flag was missing. It was permanently donated in 1912. Continuing restoration and preservation efforts to this day have removed roughly 1.7 million stitches from an old 1914 backing, gently cleaned the fragile fabric, and attached a polyester support to ensure its longevity.

Our freedom is worth preserving and remembering. For 250 years Americans have demonstrated that something as priceless as liberty is not only expected to be hard fought, frequently tattered and torn, occasionally bloodied and bruised, but it is also something extremely fragile and incredibly delicate. It is to be revered, celebrated, admired, honored and cherished.

Trustee's Corner



June is the start of Summer, and with change coming to the seasons, change comes to the Trustees. Starting June 2nd, we will now meet only once a month, on the first Tuesday of the month at 4:30PM (immediately following the House Committee Meeting).

We Looked at everything we've done for the past year, and in light of the ballooning costs of electrical panels and APS charges, we voted to go back to basics by cancelling our RV expansion. We are laser focused on replacing the 600AMP electrical Panel on the west side of the building with a NEW 800AMP panel. Our existing 600 AMP no longer meets safety code for Prescott Valley. We are still waiting on final costs from APS.

Other projects for the benefit of our members are:

1. Fill in culvert in RV park
2. Getting quotes on redoing the parking lot.
3. Looking at getting our roof repaired and into "like new" condition. We are gathering quotes now.
4. Approved were a commercial vacuum cleaner for \$299 + tax
5. Approved rental of Flag Day Chairs and music for \$410
6. Approved purchase of 4 tables for \$225 for Children's Sewing Class.

By-Laws Amendment

This is a notification regarding a suggested addition to our By-Laws to be voted on during the regular meeting set for August 4th, 2026.

"By-Law: Closure of Social Quarters for Ticketed Events"

Authorization: The House Committee, with the approval of the Board of Trustees and the Floor of the Lodge, may designate specific ticketed events, fundraisers, or private functions that require the temporary closure of the Social Quarters to general membership.

Notification: Members shall be notified of such closures via the Lodge bulletin, email blast, or prominent posting within the Lodge at least fourteen (14) days prior to the event, unless it is an emergency or urgent scheduling matter.

Admission: During these designated events, entry to the Social Quarters area will be restricted to ticket holders only.

This new By-Law is to enable the closure of certain areas of the lodge for ticketed fundraising events. Only those who purchase or possess a ticket for the event will be allowed to attend. Each event will need a budget that outlines income, expenses, and profits, and it must receive separate approval from the House Committee, the Board of Trustees, and the Floor of the Lodge. There will be discussions prior to voting at each of these three stages. If approved at all levels, the event will be authorized to move forward.

The benefit of this new By-Law is that it allows our members and guests to participate in special events while also supporting our charitable initiatives. However, the drawback is that during the event hours, non-ticketed members will not be permitted entry to the social quarters.

Elk Of The Month



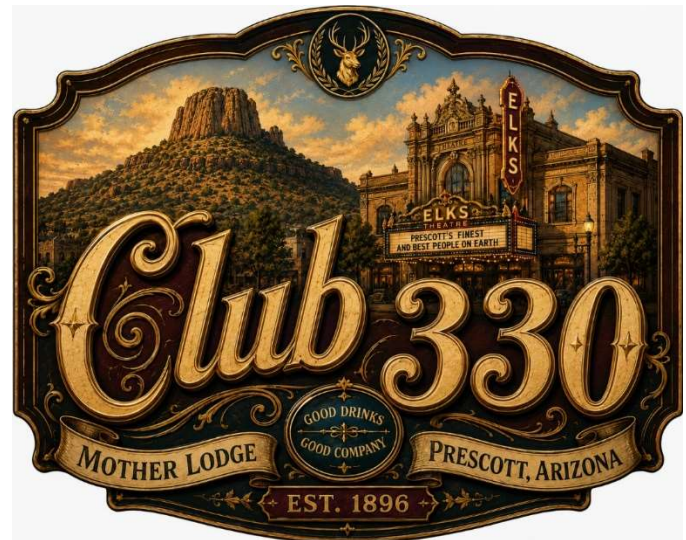

Membership Cards FYI

Your Membership Card, which was presented to you by the Secretary is a means of identification. You should carry it with you at all times. You are required to present it to gain admission to this Lodge, and without it, you cannot gain admission to another Lodge.

Did you know that there are five different kinds of membership cards? Each card must be signed and has a list of things allowed or not permitted. Please ensure that you understand the restrictions and permissions.

Your **Prescott Elks Membership Card** is for your use ONLY. It must be signed by the member and cannot be loaned to anyone else. With it, you are able to enter the social quarters and sign for guests to enter. You are solely responsible for the actions of your guests while at the Lodge. You will present your membership card to attend Lodge meetings and vote in matters of the Lodge. You may also, if desired, request a spouse card.

With a **Spouse's Card**, which must be signed by the member and spouse, your spouse is able to enter the social quarters and sign for guests to enter. The spouse may NOT attend Lodge meetings nor vote in matters of the Lodge. As the member, you are solely responsible for the actions of your spouse and guests while they are at the Lodge.

To obtain a **Widow's Membership Card**, the un-remarried widow (or widower) of a deceased member in good standing simply needs to contact the Lodge Secretary at the specific Elks Lodge where the late member was registered. You must be the un-remarried widow or widower of an Elk in good standing at the time of their passing. With this card, the Widow is able to enter the social quarters and sign for guests to enter. They may NOT attend Lodge meetings nor vote in matters of the Lodge.

As a **Visiting Member** of another Lodge, your Membership card will allow you to enter the social quarters and sign for guests to enter. You are solely responsible for the actions of your guests while at the Lodge. You will present your membership card to attend Lodge meetings and you will be formally introduced at the Lodge meeting. You cannot vote in matters of this Lodge. You may also, if desired, request an Associate Membership card.

As a visiting member of another Lodge, your **Associate Membership** card will allow you to buzz to enter the social quarters and sign for guests to enter. You are solely responsible for the actions of your guests while at the Lodge. You will present your Associate Membership card to attend Lodge meetings, but cannot vote in matters of this Lodge.

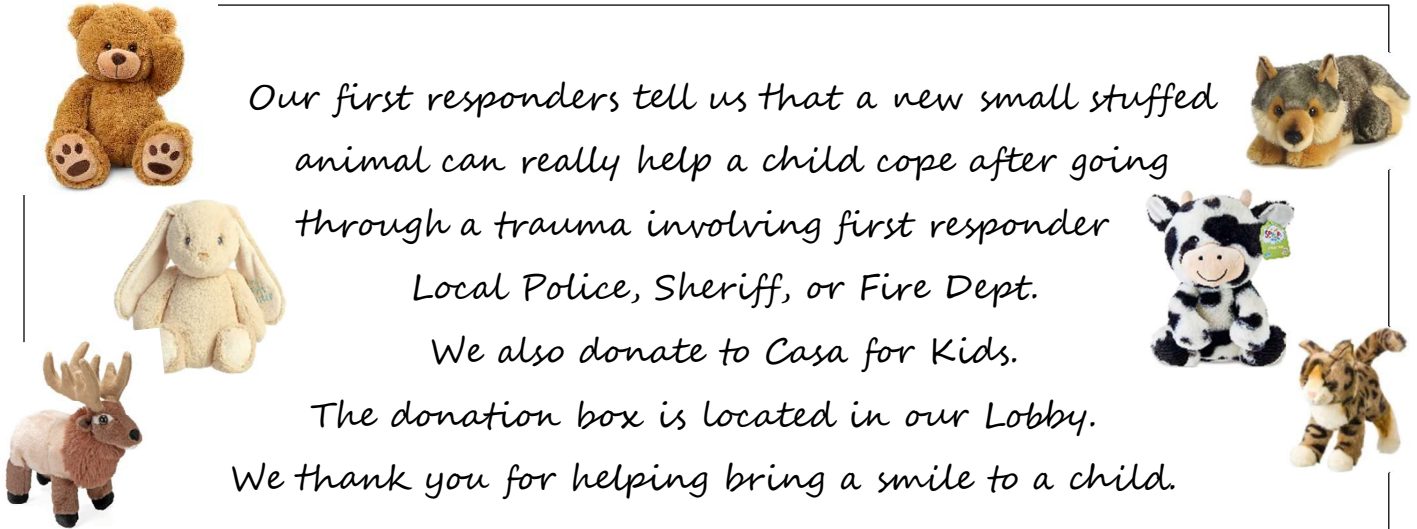
