2019 Scholarships Awarded

This year, we were pleased to award \$5,000 in scholarships to five deserving students. For the first time the Loveland Elks Lodge hosted their own scholarship application and judging rather than simply reviewing the applications passed to us through the ENF's Most Valuable Student Competition (that judging took place in December). This allowed for many area students to complete an application guided by the values and priorities of our local lodge. Each student detailed below receive a \$1000 scholarship

Andy Geisler Memorial Scholarship:

Zachary Harstad is a 2019 graduate of Loveland High School and is a three-season athlete, participating in Football, Basketball and Baseball. Zach also served as a representative in the LHS Student Council and was a member of the National Honor Society. Zach plans to attend Regis University in the fall to study Health and Exercise Science and is looking forward to playing baseball for Regis as well, potentially helping him pursue his dream of being drafted into the Major League; Zachary credits baseball with teaching him some of his most important lessons, including "how to work as a team, how to have a strong work ethic, how to deal with pressure, how to handle failure, how to keep focused and tune people out when they're yelling at you, and learning how to push through when you feel like giving up."

The Lodge awarded three scholarships from the Charity in Education fund:

Damian Zhou is a 2019 graduate of Thompson Valley High School. Damian's legacy at TVHS includes acting as the Varsity Goalkeeper for soccer and single handedly founding and running an after-school Origami club for elementary students in an effort to provide learning and entertainment for students waiting until evening for their parents to pick them up. Damian is looking forward to pursuing a career as a computer software engineer through his collegiate studies and credits his excitement for college in part to his participation in Knowledge Bowl, as "it has definitely solidified my decision to pursue a higher form of education. Knowledge is so satisfying and fulfilling to have, not just at competitions, but everywhere in my life."

Kaitlyn Haag is a 2019 graduate of Mountain View High School and is excited to continue her education in order to return right back to the classroom as an Elementary School Teacher. Kaitlyn acted as a captain of the MVHS Girl's Golf team and was also a manager of the Boy's Golf Team, and has also spent a significant amount of time volunteering as a leader for her church's middle school-aged youth group, stating that it has been "empowering to see the youth grow in their faith every week." Kaitlyn also holds a job at Scheel's, where she works 25-30 hours per week and is proud that she has been able to manage the balance of working with her school and athletic commitments.

Stephanie Haberkon is a 2019 graduate of Berthoud High School. In the fall she will begin a six-year pursuit of a Physician's Assistant degree with an emphasis in dermatology. Stephanie has participated in both Softball and Golf throughout her career at BHS, and has also spent a lot of time volunteering. One of the programs Stephanie volunteers for that she said has particularly impacted her is acting as a mentor in a program called Kids Hope: "I currently mentor a young girl in the fourth grade who has behavioral issues and a difficult home life, and it has been an extremely humbling experience. Each week, I spend one hour with her helping her complete her homework, talk about her life, play games, and be there for her as a friend and a role model. Through this rewarding opportunity, I have been able to make a positive impact on a child who has not been as fortunate as I have, and there is nothing more rewarding."

The Scholarship Committee was also proud to award an additional scholarship made possible by the Elks National Foundation through the Colorado Elks Association:

This year our CEA scholarship was awarded to **Mason Rykovich**, a 2019 graduate of Loveland High School. Mason "went out on a limb" his freshman year and joined Cross Country, which has turned into a four-year career that culminated in a senior year as a team captain. He was also a four-year member and captain of the basketball team and participated in Key Club and National Honor Society. Mason is also proud of balancing work and a nearly-full time job his senior year, and is excited to attend college in the fall to pursue a degree in Biomedical Science. According to Mason, "I want to help my family and other families live meaningful and fulfilling lives through the improvement of medicine and health services. Having been personally touched by diseases that still have no cures has only fueled my desire to assist in the betterment of future medical resources."

Are you a King Soopers shopper? Do you want to help the Lodge?

King Soopers has begun a new program called **Community Rewards**. It replaces the old cash card that customers had to use to support their non-profit of choice. This program is easy and will allow you, as a customer, to direct financial support to the non-profit you choose just by using your *rewards* card at check-out. It does not interfere with getting gas credits at the same time.

Our Lodge is listed but it takes a one-time designation for the Lodge to begin receiving your support. The more members designating the Lodge, the greater the benefit will be.

If you already have a loyalty card:

Log in to your King Soopers account - go to <http://www.kingsoopers.com>.

Select "Community Rewards" (depending on the computer, tablet or phone you are using it may be in the left column or at the bottom of the page).

Search for Loveland Elks Lodge #1051 either by name or UG797 and then click Enroll.

New users will need to create an account which requires some basic information, a valid email address and a *rewards* card. If you don't have a card, you can pick one up at Customer Service in the store (they are free).

You can use the card at any store that takes the King Soopers *rewards* card. Just swipe your registered King Soopers *rewards* card or use the phone number that is related to your registered King Soopers when shopping for the purchases to count.

REMEMBER, purchases will not count for the Elks until after you register your *rewards* card.
