PER Regina received assistance from Marra's Pharmacy who assembled the gift bags. Our Lodge also hosted a blood drive on May 18th. On May 27th, our amazing fish sale returned, no walk-ins/phone orders only and contactless curbside delivery of food to customers. Thanks to House Committee Chair Stan and the House Committee who have been busy making repairs and renovations to the Lodge and to all members who pitched in to clean the inside and outdoors. The inside of the Lodge and outside grounds look so much better – it really makes a big difference! At the recommendation of our Lodge Sponsor I have recently been appointed by the Past District Deputy Association of the Northeast District Chairperson for <u>Charitable Records</u>. As Secretary I have been responsible for reporting any and all charitable functions that we as lodge have done. With this appointment I will be the coordinator between the State Chairperson and the Lodges of the District.

I recently received a communication from Joseph Benoit, PDDGER, State & District Charitable Records Chairman.

This year has been very difficult for the Charitable Records Reporting as many of our programs will not be happening or have been severely reduced.

"I am reaching out to all Elk Members that participate in any type of charitable function you may be doing on your own, which is not part of an Elks Committee. Some examples of what I am looking for include, but are not limited to the following:

We have members that volunteer their time at Hospitals, Nursing Homes, Food Banks, Schools or other organizations. Some spend time coaching youth sports teams, or being a scout master, or other youth event, sending care packages to Military people (even if it's a son/daughter if you send enough for them to share).

Make donations to any organization such as St Jude, American Heart Association, or the like. This time of the Covid-19 Virus has added many new opportunities such as checking on neighbors, family, or the elderly to see if they need help to get through this very difficult time, making face masks, for people or groups, or many other things. As an Elk, if you do any of these things, our organization can and should take credit for them. Your name will never be used in the reporting; only the Hours and miles spent doing the work, and the dollar value of cash or non-cash donation.

It is extremely important for us to keep our Charitable Records Reporting as high as we can by taking credit for all we do. There is so much that we do that never gets reported and much credit is lost. Please help me to increase our credits by letting us report on all you do. If you don't know the actual hours or Miles, it is OK to use an estimated amount. All you have or will do from April 1, 2020 to March 31, 2021 is reportable. Send the info whenever it happens.
