Tom Marmon is heading up our Centennial Lodge Renovation Project; he has more details on this in this issue.




Claudia is also hard at work: she is the chair of our 100 Year Celebration which will be September 24th, 2022.

Donation Requests

100 years ago, our forefathers had an idea to start an Elk's lodge in Caldwell. One can only imagine the hard work, determination, and dedication it must have taken to start this lodge. Well, we are still here today 100 years later and still doing great things in our community.

As we celebrate the 100 year anniversary, it is incumbent upon each and every one of us to pass on the traditions to the next generation of dedicated Elks. To accomplish this, we need to improve our building. This will require significant financial contributions. Some projects that we have identified include major clean up, both inside and out, painting the interior and exterior.

Updating the walls and putting in LED lighting. We need to replace all the sinks and toilets throughout the building as well as insulate in order to bring down the cost of utilities. We plan to update and expand our RV parking spaces; as well as build a display case for our 100 years' worth of memorabilia.

Plans are in the works to also place an Elks Statute on the premises. Part of that plan is to install security cameras, new flooring throughout the building and improving/updating the kitchen and its equipment. Our whole building needs updates, and we will also need a lot of volunteers, their time, skills and dedication. With the members help, we can not only raise the much-needed funds, but we can keep costs down with our combined skilled labor

We are in search of major donors, one of which we have already secured. You will find two different donation forms within the newsletter. One for the granite wall for those donating \$250, \$500, \$1000, \$2,500 and \$5,000. The deadline for these donations will be August 1, 2022. The second form will be for donations of \$100 and \$150 dollars; and your names will go on a nice wooden plaque with brass name plates.
