Antler Club Storage Closet

As our ABC Liquor license allows our members to bring in their own liquor for their enjoyment, the Antler Club has provided a storage closet behind the bar so it will be available when the member visits. At the current time, there are many bottles being maintained in the storage closet that have been there for at least a year. We know this because the bartenders label them with the member's name and the month/year it was brought in.

In a past Board of Director's meeting, a motion was passed enabling the Bartenders to remove all liquor bottle(s) stored at the Antler Club for longer than 1 year. As such, any bottle that is in the storage closet that has a date greater than 1 year at the beginning of each month will be discarded. Please, if you know or believe you may have one of these bottles, come in and remove it so you can enjoy it.

Antler Club Electronic Payment Change

We continue to improve our facility and try to make things better and easier for our members and guests. We have been accepting Credit Cards and Debit Cards for the payment of your tab in the Antler Club or hall rentals. New procedures prohibit the use of Credit/Debit Cards for any LODGE expenditures, effective November 15, 2021.

Note, that you are not able to obtain cash or purchase any gambling related items by using your card. The ATM will remain for those wishing to obtain cash.

Articles:

New members and Initiations: We continue to receive applications for new members. This is great, for it is only through our members that we are able to meet our obligations to Veterans, the Community, our Lodge, and to the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks as a whole. Keep up the great work in bring in new members that you feel meet our requirements and that will embrace Elkdom.

Messages/Letters have been/are being sent to everyone to tell them the date/time for their initiation. If you have sponsored someone to become a member, please tell them to be on the lookout for this information.

Lastly, please remember that when you submit someone for membership you should attend the Lodge meeting to provide character witness to whom you are supporting.

The Hall: Need a location for your special event; don't forget the Lodge Hall is available for your parties. Think of the Lodge when scheduling those office off-site business meetings; plenty of space for Wedding, baby/bridal showers. The hall is available days and nights. Contact a Trustee for additional information.

Box Tops for Education/Campbell's Labels: Have no kids at home or no school to donate your box tops? Clip those box tops and soup labels. Bring them to the Club and place them in the lock box under the Elk head. Monthly the Lodge will deliver them to a different local school for their use.

Soda Can Tabs: When purchasing canned soda from the bar, remember to remove the opening tab and give them to the bartenders. These tabs are donated to local charities such as Ronald McDonald House and Dialysis Centers. Save your tabs at home and bring them to the Club.

Elks Organ Donor Program: Organ transplantation is one of the most remarkable success stories in the history of medicine. In most cases, it's the only hope for thousands of people suffering from organ failure or in desperate need of corneas, skin, bone or other tissues. Tragically, the need for donated organs and tissues continues to outpace the supply. Right now, thousands of Americans could be helped if enough organs and tissues were available.

Organ and tissue donations provide each of us with a special opportunity to help others. You can save lives by making the decision to be an organ and tissue donor. When you apply for a driver's license, or photo ID card, you will be asked if you wish to become an organ donor. If you decide to become a donor, your choice will be noted on the front of your driver's license or photo ID card. By saying "Yes" to organ donation, you could save or improve the quality of life for more than 50 others who suffer from organ failure, bone defects, burns or blindness. - 10. Note cards, writing pad and pen
- 11. Feminine products
