ENF MVS SCHOLARSHIP

Most Valuable Student (MVS) Contest: The 2024 MVS application is now open.

Applications can be found online at <u>enf.elks.org/MVS</u>. The application dead-line is November 12, 2024 at midnight.

The Elks National Foundation (ENF) awards 500 four-year scholarships based on academics, leadership, and financial need. National awards range from \$1,000 per year to \$7,500 per year.

The national awards will be announced in April 2024. Our state Elks Association also offers scholarships and uses the application above as their basis for the Iowa scholarships.

MVS scholarships are for students pursuing a four-year degree on a full-time basis (minimum of 12 semester hours), at a U.S. college or university next school year.

Some important applicant details include:

- Current high school seniors (or equivalent) who are citizens of the United States are eligible to apply.
- Applicants do not have to be related to a member of the Elks.
- Male and female students compete separately.

We are having our traditional Christmas Open House at the Iowa Veterans Home this year on **December 7th**. Additionally, we are planning to hold smaller Christmas Socials and Holiday Parties on the units for residents and staff.

We are asking for monetary donations to purchase cookies for our residents to enjoy during the holiday season. If you chose to send a monetary donation, treats will be ordered from local bakeries and delivered to IVH a day before the event.

You can also prepare homemade cookies! We accept cut-out Christmas cookies that have been frosted and decorated— suggestions include oatmeal, chocolate chip, peanut butter, sugar etc. Please place the cookies in an air tight container or Ziplock bag so the cookies don't dry out and become too hard.

Please avoid bar-type cookies such as brownies, tollhouse bars, etc. as they do not hold up well during shipping and they dry out quickly.

Place the cookies in a small box - no larger than 12" by 12" by 6" deep, if possible. Larger boxes have a tendency to crush, making the cookies crumble and break. Please layer the decorated cookies between layers of waxed paper and wrap the cookies in something airtight like gallon size zip lock bags.

You may drop off cookies to our loading dock at the northwest corner of the Malloy building or ship to IVH.
