Kansas City, Missouri, welcomes Members of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks for the 160th Grand Lodge Convention. Kansas City is located along a stretch of the Missouri River in the west-central part of the state—close to the Missouri-Kansas state line—and is the largest city in the state by both area and population. Visitors will find a wealth of attractions to explore in Kansas City, including many unique museums and hometown restaurants.

From the downtown area, many of Kansas City's must-see attractions can be accessed by riding the KC Streetcar, the city's free streetcar service, which travels a two-mile-long north-south route and makes a total of sixteen stops, most of which are along Main Street. The final stop at the southern terminus is just north of Pershing Road, close to Union Station, which boasts a planetarium, an award-winning fine dining restaurant called Pierpont's, and historical exhibits.

Just south of Union Station across Pershing Road is the National World War I Museum and Memorial, home to the 217-foot-tall Liberty Memorial Tower. Visitors can explore an 80,000-square-foot museum space containing the world's largest and most encompassing collection of World War I artifacts, including photographs, maps, medals, uniforms, posters, and artillery.

Situated less than three miles south of the National WWI Museum and Memorial along Main Street is Country Club Plaza, an outdoor shopping and dining district. Guests can admire the Plaza's Spanish-inspired architecture, red-tiled roofs, and ornate ironwork. Just

east of the Plaza, visitors can explore Kansas City's largest art museum, the Nelson-Atkins Museum of Art, which houses more than 40,000 works of art that span 5,000 years of history.

Other museums not to be missed are the American Jazz Museum and the Negro Leagues Baseball Museum. They share an address at 1616 East 18th Street, just one mile northeast of the convention center in Kansas City's historic 18th and Vine District. The American Jazz Museum offers exhibits and artifacts recounting a century of the city's rich jazz history. The Negro Leagues Baseball Museum tells the story of teams in the leagues, including the Kansas City Monarchs of the 1920s, and is sure to appeal to both history buffs and sports enthusiasts.

Kansas City has a rich culinary scene but is best known for its world-class barbecue. Many of the city's most famous barbecue establishments are near the downtown area, including Arthur Bryant's at 1727 Brooklyn Avenue and Q39 at 1000 West 39th Street. These popular spots serve up classics like brisket and spare ribs, as well as a regional favorite called burnt ends, consisting of caramelized chunks of meat cut from the fatty end of a brisket.

Whether visitors to Kansas City are in the mood for a heaping helping of barbecue, a ride on the KC Streetcar, or a stroll through a museum, they will find a feast for their senses in Kansas City.
