A message from Vicky Taylor, Lecturing Knight

I hope you had a chance to come to the fish fry the last week in March. Y'all that was some good eats. Exalted ruler greens, lecturing princess Mac n cheese, cornbread biscuits. Homemade pineapple upside down cake provided by Tammy Bechen. We hoped to have at least 45-60 folks show up and ended with 83 diners plus kitchen and bar staff. Hats off to our barkeep that evening (Ben) he put his head down and started pouring.

Dinner was made possible from a generous non member, George Norenberg who had a freezer full of fish to share that master fryers Chris Murphy and Joe Bechen cooked to perfection.

Many people asked me for the cornbread biscuit recipe and as I don't have everyone's contact info I will share it here:

Ingredients

Cornbread Biscuits

- 1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1/2 cup cornmeal
- 1/4 cup granulated sugar
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 cup (1 stick) butter, melted & slightly cooled
- 1/2 cup sour cream (full fat is best)
- 1/2 cup milk (higher percentage is better, I use half & half milk)

Optional Butter Topping

- 3 tablespoons melted butter
- 1/2 cup maple syrup

Instructions

- Heat oven to 450°. Prepare a cookie sheet by lining with parchment paper, silpat liner, or spray with cooking spray.
- In a mixing bowl, combine the flour, cornmeal, sugar, baking powder, baking soda, and salt. Whisk together to break up any clumps.
- In a smaller bowl (I use the same 2-cup glass measurer that I melted the butter in) combine the melted butter, sour cream, and milk. Whisk together until combined. Pour into the dry ingredients and gently stir together. Just stir until combined and no flour pockets remain in the dough.
- Drop the dough (each biscuit is 1/4 cup) onto the prepared cookie sheet. You can use two large spoons, a cookie scoop, or a 1/4 cup measuring cup to drop the biscuit dough.
- Bake for 12-14 minutes. Outside should be golden brown and the inside will be soft and fluffy.
 Just make sure to cook until the middle is no longer wet. Use a toothpick if you have to, to test the middle.
- OPTIONAL TOPPING: Combine the melted butter and syrup in a small pan, heat n stir until it is Incorporated. Drizzle over biscuits after they come out of oven.

TRUSTEE CORNER

Meet your 2024-2025 Trustees: Head Trustee Roger Fiori PER, Becky Young PER, Jeff Garrison PER, Tim Pettit, and Mark Radosevich.

When we became Trustees, we all agreed to use the utmost prudence and good judgement in our attention to the finances and property of this Lodge, and to be diligent in performing this responsibility. The Trustees, and the Board of Directors, over the 30+ years of our charter have done a very good job to get us where we are today. From multiple building moves to guiding us through Covid. Not all decisions were easy and popular with membership. Decisions are made by what is best for the Lodge.

The Trustees are always open to members' ideas and encourage all members to bring their ideas to the board meetings on the first Monday of the month. This meeting is your forum to have your ideas heard and discussed before it goes to membership for approval. Please keep in mind that even though an idea is adopted, it may take time for the Trustees to act on it due to priority of other projects. After our last Trustee meeting the decision was made to ask anyone wanting to start a tab in the clubroom to supply a credit/debit card. The reason for this is twofold. The first reason is when the bartenders are busy, and you are ready to leave. They can quickly get you your bill as they already have your credit card on file. Secondly, every once in a while, someone will leave forgetting to pay their tab. This will allow the bartender to close your tab. Please keep in mind they will also charge a 20% gratuity. At the end of the night when the bartenders close out the register all credit/debit card information is DELETED. Our system does not have the ability to store this information.

Please keep in mind if you want to pay your tab in cash you still can. Just let the bartender know when you start your tab.

The Trustees also ask that everyone please be courteous to our bartenders at all times. Especially when they are having a busy night. The bartenders are instructed to take care of people waiting in line for a drink first. If you are sitting at the bar, we ask that you please wait patiently until the bartender can get to you. The Trustees also made the decision to have 2 bartenders available on Wednesday meals that bring in large crowds as well as any event that will bring in a large crowd. Our Event Coordinator Becky Young will let Jeff know when there is a potential need for 2 bartenders. Please do not go to the bar manager directly with this request as these all need to go through Becky as there maybe a fee required to have a second bartender for your event.


