
I look forward to serving as your Exalted Ruler and working together to strengthen our Lodge and its mission.

Reminder to All:

The bartender who is volunteering at the lodge is the person who is in charge of the bar/lounge.. This includes the sound system and Ticket machine and other tickets. These may only be turned on once the bartender is ready to have them working. The ticket machine is a State regulated" Game of chance" and certain rules must be followed. One important rule to note is that tickets that are played must be turned in that day. Tickets that are taken out of the Lodge cannot be brought back in and tuned in for cash. They are considered invalid. We need all members who play to comply.




