




Largo Lodge's Annual Flag Day Celebration will be held on Sunday, June 8th. at 11:00 a.m.


It is a pleasure to serve as Chairman of The Americanism Committee for our Lodge #2159.

To me, being an American citizen is a multifaceted experience that involves freedom, personal responsibility, and the pursuit of equality. When someone asks. Over time, these rights and responsibilities have developed along with the country.
