"OUR KIDS" Washington Elks Therapy Program for Children, Inc. Our State Major Project



There are many barriers that families with special needs children face daily. While these barriers are unique to each family's circumstances, there are several common themes. These might be long distances to a therapy clinic, long waitlists for service, lack of transportation, or medical fragility of the child.

For 70 years the Washington Elks Therapy Program for Children has strived to fill those gaps and bring occupational and physical therapy to the children and their families.

For the family of Wan Xing (11), Neva Marie (11), and Julia Ann (13), having therapy come to them is extremely helpful. Families with multiple special needs children require extensive planning simply to leave the house. It requires thinking about and bringing changes of clothes, ample medication, feeding supplies, and even which activities to bring to entertain the other children while they are waiting for a sibling.

Due to the complexity of each of their medical issues, Wan Xing, Neva, and Julia Ann's family regularly travels hours, multiple times per month to be seen by specialists. Sometimes they can orchestrate multiple appointments in a day and sometimes they are only able to address one child's need, just to turn around and travel again shortly thereafter for a different set of specialists.

The Elks have been able to provide this family with relief from the burden of traveling to address their therapy needs, providing everyone a much-needed break.
